

# Black History Month


A message from Mrs Weaver.

#### Muhammad Ali

PROFESSIONAL BOXER, SOCIAL ACTIVIST, AND PHILANTHROPIST

January 17, 1942 - June 3, 2016

Muhammad Ali won the world boxing heavyweight title three times. During his two-decade career, he won 56 matches and only had five losses. His career came to a pause when he was drafted in the Vietnam War. He refused to do so, citing its conflict with his Islamic faith and his opposition to the US participation in the war. His championship title was then revoked and he was banned from the sport for three years. He regained his championship title in 1974, where he said the infamous quote

"float like a butterfly, sting like a bee."

• DID YOU KNOW? •

Born Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr., he changed his name to Muhammad Ali when he converted to Islam under Malcom X's influence. After retiring in1984, he focused on philanthropy by supporting causes such as Parkinson's disease research and the Special Olympics. He also became the UN Messenger of Peace in 1998.

Before becoming a professional boxer, he won a boxing gold medal as part of the US Team in the 1960 Olympics.
