Dear Parents/Carers,

I am delighted to be able to write to you in what feels like a more 'normal' time for our students and staff. The impact of Covid-19 as we know has been significant on everyone but none more so than the students. One of the areas affected the most has been student attendance with the national average reducing from 94% to 85%. I am pleased to report at KSS that student attendance has rocketed in the last few weeks and Mrs Hume the attendance manager reports daily with the remarkable improvements being made.

The House system launched by Mrs Castrey in the last half term has started to make an impact with all individual student achievements being added to the collective House team totals. We are planning some exciting rewards for the leading Houses over the next few weeks.

The school was delighted to be a feature on BBC Radio Stoke during the 18th of February John Acres breakfast show, as Mark Bright spoke about his affinity to the school and his delight at being voted to represent one of the school houses. In other news, the students are consistently achieving remarkable things. The Year 11's are fully engaged in a second mock examination window, the Year 10's have made dramatic improvements in attitude and growth mindset and we are looking forward to celebrating this at the parents evening later this month. The Year 9 students have started to show accelerated progress and the options process will be taking place for this cohort after the Easter holidays.

The Year 8 students have been reorganised into new teaching groups which is seeing better behaviours and engagement levels, whilst the fantastic Year 7 group have continued to shine.

Over the next few weeks we will also be visited by Year 5 students from our local primary schools. This is designed to build greater links with future KSS students and support KS2 students in their transition to secondary school. Watch this space for updates on Facebook and in future Headteacher bulletins.

Finally, a thank you to parents/carers for your continued support. It isn't ideal at the moment with the restricted access to Gloucester Road and the impact that this is having on the local area but punctuality to school has improved after an alarming dip in January. It is an important life skill to be on time at the start of the day so we thank you for your support with this and with all aspects of our 'Code of Conduct'.
