The students have been set the challenge of achieving over 90% attendance and less than eight behaviour points over the next four weeks to qualify for the whole school Easter reward trip at 'The Crocky Trail'. This trip looks like it could be the best reward trip yet. A special mention to Mrs Castrey for her hard work in organising these trips.

When we return we will be starting the year 9 options process ready for the students to select their GCSE studies for the start of Year 10. We will be holding a face to face parents evening/options event after Easter and Mrs Castrey will be in touch with the finer details in due course.

The school will also be sending home progress reports over the next half term to ensure that you are updated regarding subject performance. As a staff team, we have been looking at ways in which to ensure that each student maximises their potential. We will look forward to seeing this work make a significant impact.

Finally, I would like to wish you all a restful break and a reminder that students will return to school on Monday the 27th of February 2023. We look forward to welcoming the students back for a really important half term before the Easter holidays.




E-Sports Event

Well done to all involved.



















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

- As part of your Enrichment, we have our second exciting visit off Next Engineers. You will take part in two workshops in which you will have to show all of our LORIC Values - leadership, organisation, resilience, initiative and communication skills to successfully complete team challenges.
- In the National Apprenticeships Activity session you will have the opportunity to explore what apprenticeships are, what jobs you can do linked to them and how you can get started on looking for apprenticeships.
- Your VR Workshop will talk to you about the routes into careers in this area, followed by the opportunity to have a go on them.





















Your focus for today is 'Independent Living using LORIC values'.

- NCS are visiting us to lead you through a lesson on Budgeting and how you can do this successfully in the future using organisation skills to support.
- Two of your other lessons are based around independent living activities that you will soon be doing. These are looking at buying and furnishing accommodation using budgeting.



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
House Update


