I was delighted to receive emails from parents/carers once the report was shared and your own pride in the Ofsted judgement shone through. It is genuinely a team effort and the support also of the Shaw Education Trust has been invaluable.

Rest assured that the journey towards outstanding is already underway and we are taking the areas for improvement from the report and throwing all of our collective energy at improving the school further.

I was personally delighted that Ofsted recognised the impact of the iPads. As these have become embedded into school life it is easy to forget the investment and the innovation around the use of digital technologies. We will develop their use even further over the months and terms ahead. The students have even been creating digital montages based on the Ofsted report in recent digital skills lessons!

Over the next few weeks we have lots of events taking place and we cannot wait to share with you the photographs and testimonials from staff about the upcoming enrichment day and sports day in particular. What was commented on by Ofsted was how much we are able offer wit a proportionally smaller staff body than most schools. This has never been a barrier as we work tirelessly to make memorable learning moments for our students.

Year 10 started their first window of mock GCSE examinations this week and we have been very impressed at how focused they are, even in recent warmer weather. We have really high hopes for this year group and the results they will achieve in August 2024. We are also electing new Head Students next week, thank you to all students that put themselves forward for these important positions.

The year 9 options process has gone swimmingly and the vast majority of students have got the choices that they wanted. We cannot wait to start teaching the new courses on offer such as Engineering Manufacture, which will begin in September 2023.

On this note there will be extensive works being undertaken over the summer break as the school receives further investment from the Shaw Education Trust to improve the facilities that we are offering. KSS will have a new state of the art catering room built, along with an exciting engineering space. I will look forward to updating you on the developments over the next few weeks, this is another exciting chapter for KSS as we move towards outstanding.

A message from Mrs Postlethwaite...

From September 2023, the old red KSS uniform and black/white tartan skirt will no longer be worn in school, and all students will need to wear the new blue uniform regardless of year group. As you are aware, we have recently relaxed our uniform for the final few weeks of term to ensure students are comfortable in the hot weather. We are going to write this into the uniform policy for September so that students will be able to wear tailored black shorts instead of trousers and will be able to attend school without a blazer from May half term each year. If you have any feedback on this change, please don't hesitate to contact me.

Shoes

Just a reminder ahead of preparing for September that school shoes need to be a shoe rather than a boot or trainer. I am aware that some shops including Clarks make shoes that they market as 'sneakers' which would not be suitable. Please contact us if you wish to check any style of shoes before you buy. As always, Nike, Converse, Lonsdale and other sports brands are not suitable as school shoes.

Jewellery

Please could I ask for your support in ensuring that the only jewellery worn to school is a pair of studs. Any nose studs need to be clear. We have had a large increase in students getting piercings during school time which they then state cannot be removed for 6 weeks. Please support us with our high expectations by checking for jewellery as your child leaves for school or returns home.

Eyelashes and False Nails

We appreciate that students may wish to have false nails and lashes, especially in preparation for a school holiday. Unfortunately these are not suitable for school and we ask that if allowing your child to get these on, an additional appointment is scheduled to have these removed before students return to school in September.

Maths

A message from Mrs McDermott...



Year 8 students have been learning about Caesar ciphers in maths. They were posed with the cross curricular question;

"What do Apple computers, World War 2 and Pride have in common?"

Students made their own cipher decoder and used it to decipher messages about Alan Turing and his role within World War 2 which was when he invented some of the earliest computers to crack a lot of the codes used by the Nazis. They also discovered Alan Turing was a gay man, who was arrested in 1952 due to homosexuality being illegal in the United Kingdom at this time. In 2017 the UK Government introduced 'The Alan Turning Law' which grants a pardon to people convicted for their sexuality.

As an additional challenge some students went on to decipher the binary coded message on our £50 notes, which feature Alan Turing, it reveals Turing's date of birth.





A **Caesar cipher** or **shift cipher** is a simple substitution cipher where the text is shifted <u>a number of</u> times up or down a known alphabet.

A 'shift of 5' means that you move each letter down 5 places. <u>So</u> A goes to F (5 letters higher).

HELLO becomes MJQQT.

You can use a cipher wheel to help you crack these codes.







Maths

Year 10 were given the challenge of helping to catch main characters from the popular TV series Prison Break this week. They were given a set of clues and a map to help them pinpoint characters hideouts. Using scale drawings and loci, they diligently worked through the clues to locate relevant areas on the map and pass on the information to the authorities. Well done year 10, LORIC values in plain sight during this activity, particularly resilience.
