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Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to a new school year and the first bulletin of 2023-2024!

Although we are only three weeks back, what a busy and action packed few weeks it has been.

We welcomed our new Year 7 students, who have made a strong start to life at KSS. We have been very impressed with how smart they look, how keen they have been to engage in learning and how great their attendance has been so far.

Since we have returned we have undertaken a conscious shift with students to ensure relentless focus upon their own academic success. The KSS journey has been amazing over the last few years and the way in which all aspects of the school has improved has been something that we are all proud of. The next step of our school improvement journey is for us to ensure that every student has a real academic ambition to achieve the best possible grades that they can in their final examinations. This is where parent/carer support can make a tremendous difference.

Mrs Frost and Mrs Postlethwaite have been working with our heads of subjects to shape a supportive programme for our Year 11 students. This includes weekly mentoring, form time interventions, after school sessions, early release of mock examination timetables and a comprehensive revision timetable. There is much more planned and we will share this with you in due course.

We are delighted with how the Year 11 students have returned after the break and we are confident that this will translate into academic success for this group in the summer of 2024.

In addition, the Year 10 students have also started their GCSE courses this term and they have shown real focus which has been really pleasing to see when I have popped into lots of lessons recently.

This term we have launched a new assessment strategy for all students, which will see two progress reports being sent home to parents/carers (one in February and one in July). All students will sit formal 'performance assessments' twice per year for all subjects in the school hall. This will enable us to see how the students are performing compared to their classmates, the year group but also against other schools within The Shaw Education Trust. We look forward to sharing your child's progress in a really useful and meaningful way through an updated report format.

Finally, it was my absolute pleasure last weekend and during the early part of the week to lead a trip to Krakow in Poland. I have included some images and a write up about the trip within this bulletin. The 47 students that attended really did do our school community proud. They were respectful, mature and polite in everything that they did. They were an absolute credit to you as parents/carers and a reminder of how wonderful our students are. We get so many positive comments when we take the students on visits and to see this first hand, especially when 36,000 feet in the air was pleasing. So on behalf of the staff, THANK YOU!

Students need **100% attendance** and **no more than 6 behaviour points** for the 3 week period between 18th September and 6th October in order to attend the trip.








Y10 Update


There have been lots of students having a fabulous time in Poland this week and the photos look great.



Spanish

A message from Ms Hud...

Year 9 Spanish students spent half a day at Staffordshire University's Forest School with Dr Jane Robb. We did lots of activities relating to nature and the outside, including Spanish, Geography, History and Art.

After introductions, we walked through a nature reserve, using a help sheet to identify plants and our knowledge of Geography to identify land features. We then made Spanish sentences about them, bringing our knowledge from the classroom out into the real world.

We learnt about the use of rushes in the past, and attempted to strip their outer green coating to reveal the inner foam tube which used to be used to make candle wicks.

We worked as a group to create a map of our route using only natural materials, recalling their names in Spanish.

We then sat outside and listened to a story in Spanish, and we each created a noun from this in a material of our choosing.


A message from Mrs Morrell...
































House Update
