Having a control, a boiling tube without any insulating they have been able to see which gets cold the fastest and which stays warmest the longest. Using their iPads for stopwatches it incorporates the equipment they have already to hand.

A nice visual practical, some excellent results taken, and hypothesis written.

In Year 7 in biology lessons with myself (Ms Baker) and Miss Unwin, students have been studying and exploring the heart.

They've been answering questions of where the heart pumps blood and where it receives blood from, in the body.
