ATTENDANCE WHY IT MATTERS



Persistent absence means pupils who miss more than 10% of school every year.



For each additional day of absence between years 7 to 11, the typical pupil could miss out on an average of £750 in future lifetime earnings

Persistently absent pupils in year 10 and 11 could earn £10,000 less on average at age 28, compared to pupils with near perfect attendance

This rises to almost £20k less on average at age 28 for those who are severely absent



For employability over a sustained period, people age 28 were around:



Less likely to be employed when persistently absent



Less likely to be employed when severely absent






























WATER BOTTLES


House Points

Alongside attending our face to face Parents Evenings, Jess from the Mental Health Support Team has presented assemblies and joined our Y9 and Y11 students to discuss mental health and resilience.

Learning about mental health in school is important because it helps students understand their emotions, build healthy relationships, and know when and how to seek help. Just like we learn about physical health to stay strong and avoid illness, learning about mental health teaches us how to take care of our minds.

When students understand mental health, they're more likely to recognize stress, anxiety, or depression in themselves or others and take action before things get worse. It also reduces stigma, so people feel more comfortable talking about how they feel instead of hiding their struggles. This can lead to a more supportive and respectful school environment.

When Ofsted visited the school last year they were impressed with our subject curriculums and how the students were taught the key themes.


