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Dear Parents/Carers,

Over the break, colleagues were hard at work planning for an exciting Spring term. This included the site staff who were hard at work maintaining and enhancing our fantastic school environment.

January for most, typically involves a chance to reset and take stock, with a focus on priorities for the next twelve months. At KSS, we are no exception and have set out our priorities for the year ahead.

The focus for the first part of the term will be upon student behaviour and engagement in lessons. This is a real strength of the school and an aspect that we are really proud of, but like any key school priority it can & will be improved. Myself, Mrs Postlethwaite and Mr Till will be meeting frequently to look at the behaviour trends and intervening swiftly with students that demonstrate any form of disruptive behaviour that affects the learning and progress of others. We have high expectations which we do not apologise for and this is for the benefit of all members of our school community.

Last week, myself and Mrs Postlethwaite met each and every Year 11 student individually, to open the mock examination results from the examinations held in November & December.

- We are delighted to see so may students achieving and even surpassing their targets grades.
- Where students were disappointed with their grades, this is now a real opportunity to focus for the final 71 days before the terminal examinations begin in May.
- A huge thank you to parents/carers that attended the Year 11 parents evening yesterday. We had a positive turnout which shows the fantastic support that you provide to your children.
- In the final push we will ensure that the students are supported in dealing with exam stresses and provide guidance to students that have not yet applied for their post 16 next steps.

We will be launching very soon, our breakfast initiative that has been in the pipeline for a few weeks. Each morning students will be able to grab a bagel as they enter school (free of charge) which will ensure that they have a full belly before engaging in their learning. Studies have proven that eating breakfast, makes a significant impact on learners ability to focus and concentrate. We look forward to seeing how this initiative impacts our students.

Finally, to update you all with a few staffing changes that have taken place since I last wrote to you. I am delighted to announce that Mrs Bryan has started with us as teacher of Technology. She has a wealth of experience and expertise in delivering positive outcomes for students and has a real love for practical learning. We have also appointed Mrs Frost as a the new Maths lead from January, which is a fantastic appointment. Mrs Frost has worked hard since September to improve the Maths provision and the teaching and learning experience that students engage in, I am delighted to have secured her on a permanent basis. In addition we have also appointed Ms Ayres as teacher of Maths from April 2023, who is another superb appointment to our team.

Last Friday, we said farewell to Mrs Podmore, who was a much loved and well respected teaching assistant at KSS for over ten years. She will be missed greatly by staff and students alike. He wish her every success in her new role outside of the classroom.

I am delighted to share that Ms Ayres is joining KSS after Easter.








Breakfast Initiative







A message from Mrs Morrell...


















Computing






A message from Ms Mason...


Year 7 are starting the year looking at our local heritage and why the areas around us are called 'The Potteries'.




A message from Mr Old...




Year 8 we exploring 'Characters' and the career of an Illustrator.


A message from Mrs Postlethwaite...






A message from Mrs Postlethwaite...


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
A message from Ms Mason...
