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#### Dear Parents/Carers,

Where have the first six weeks gone? We have two weeks left of the first half term of the year and its been exceptionally busy here at KSS. We have welcomed over 500 people into school for the recent open events which has been fantastic to see. The feedback we have received has been amazing and we have been blown away by the response of the Kidsgrove community. We have seen a real change in how our local community views our wonderful school which makes all of the hard work worthwhile over the last few years. The open events have been followed up by a number of tours during the school day, with guests observing the school in action. It really is a special place to be.

In the last few weeks we have been busy preparing our Year II's for their upcoming mock examinations and we continue to be impressed with their growth mindset and hard work. The individual meetings that were held really filled the leadership team with confidence that this year group are really up for the challenge of their final year. We have recently shared a survey with Year II students and the results are very encouraging in terms of subject specific support that colleagues offer and how the students are using this. It is great to see.

We held our first enrichment day of the year last Thursday which saw a range of interesting and diverse activities taking place in school. Mrs Weaver shaped the day around Relationships, Health and Wellbeing and Careers to compliment our excellent Personal Development curriculum. Today, key stage 4 students are taking part in the Alton Towers 'Scare Fest' reward trip. We were delighted to see so many students eligible for the trip as recognition for their efforts so far this year and their academic focus. We have seen a maturity especially with the Year 10 group as they have undertaken their GCSE studies and I have already mentioned how impressive Year 11 have been in the first six weeks of the term.

This week, Mrs Postlethwaite has delivered Mental Health awareness assemblies to all students and staff wore an item of yellow clothing to mark this important message. 


























## HEADTEACHER DROP IN



## Mobile Phones



We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that mobile phone use by students is not allowed during the school day. This also includes the use of smartwatches that receive and send messages.

The use of mobile phones and smartwatches in school is an unnecessary distraction for students.

We are having an increasing number of students receiving communication from parents/ carers during the school day which is then causing them to take their phones out and check them. In addition to this, we find ourselves occasionally in the position when parents are coming into school to collect students due to an issue (e.g. a falling out with friends) before we have had the chance to support the student and get to the bottom of what has happened.

Could I please ask that if you need to get a message to your child during the school day, you contact the school office and we will ensure they receive the message without the need to use a mobile device.

Our mobile phone policy states that if a phone is seen, heard or used in school, this will be taken to the office by a member of staff and parents will need to come in to collect it. We appreciate that this may cause inconvenience, so please support us by having this discussion with your child.

If smartwatches are worn in school, notifications need to be disabled.








### House Update

Please meet our new form time monitor team. This group of students will work with our form tutors every day to pass on key messages and demonstrate student leadership.


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
## Year 11 - 1:1 Meetings

## Key Stage 4 Update

### A message from Mrs Postlethwaite



It only seems like a few days ago since my last KS4 update but so much has happened in the last two weeks.

Year 11 have 116 school days left until their first GCSE exams. I'm sure the time will fly, but we are doing everything we can to ensure they are organised, supported and prepared.

In our recent Y11 'temperature check', 96% of Y11 students felt that teachers were preparing them well for the upcoming mock exams and 97% of students stated that they found the form time and after-school intervention sessions useful.

We will continue to have regular feedback from Y11 students as the year progresses to check in on how they are feeling and look at what further support is needed.

One of the biggest barriers to learning over the past two weeks at KS4 has been absence with a sharp drop during Week 6. Can we please ask that where possible, orthodontist, dentist and doctors appointments are made outside of school hours, or at the very beginning or end of the school day in order to minimise lost learning.

Year 10 students will soon begin the process of planning their work experience which will be in July (date to be confirmed.) Students will need to arrange their own placements, so I would encourage them to start thinking about the kind of workplace they might want to spend a week at.

Work experience week for our current Y11 students was a huge success last year and the students got so much out of it. I can't wait for Year 10 to have the same experiences this year!
























## Maths

A message from Ms Ayres...

Thank you so much to all the hundreds of visitors that took the time to come and see us in the maths department during our recent Open Morning and Open Evening. It really was great to see so many of you and also lots of young people enjoying a variety of maths activities. We would also like to thank the KSS students that helped us during these events. Below is a bit more detail on the Open Evening and how it links to maths and the work that students do within the curriculum.

Where's the maths in that?



We opened our doors to the community and transformed one of our maths classrooms into a fun fair for the night! You might be wondering why we did that, but there's a lot of maths in games of chance, specifically probability. We ran a hook a duck stall, higher or lower and a wheel of fortune. Working out your probability of winning can help give you an edge in games of chance or will help you decide which game is most worth your while.

Think of a game of hook a duck with 8 ducks in the pool. If you know that 3 ducks have a star on the bottom, and you win a prize if you find a star then you can calculate your odds of winning. You can also work out an estimate for the number of people who will win the game. The probability of winning is 38. To find an estimate of how many people will win we should multiply this by how many people play. For example, if 40 people play then we would estimate that 15 of them would win.

Next time you head to a fair or an arcade, take a moment to think about the amount of maths surrounding you and consider your chances of winning.





## History

We are delighted to share that Year 10 History students are taking part in a visit to the Imperial War museum North in Salford on the 17.11.23.

This will be an ideal visit for students to dive into interactive displays about their first GCSE topic 'warfare'. We think that this will add real cultural capital so that students grasp even further the impact of warfare and the changes over time in terms of weapons and tactics.






