

English

We were delighted to be joined by Manactco theatre company at the beginning of December, who performed an abridged version of 'A Christmas Carol' to our Year 10 and Year 11 students to support their studies of the novella for their English Literature GCSE!

Students had the opportunity to see the text performed and asked questions to the actors about the performance and about how to get into acting!.



Years 7, 8 and 9 have had new elements added to their English lessons:

The main focus for KS3 students is Literacy heritage- students will be reading some of the best fiction from throughout history, developing their academic and critical analysis skills. This term we have read the following texts:

Year 7: Oliver Twist

Year 8: Sherlock Holmes

Year 9: Jane Eyre





Mastery Writing: Students now have one lesson every two weeks which has a spelling, punctuation and grammar focus.

For example, Year 8 have been focusing on capital letters, full stops and using commas accurately throughout their writing. We at Kidsgrove believe that strong technical accuracy in our students' writing will support their goals, both while they remain in school and as they leave us and head off into the wider world.

And we have our Reading Fluency lessons: students are encouraged to read aloud to each other from a variety of texts, developing how quick they read, how they punctuate their readings and how they express themselves when they do. These elements will help create more confident readers.




Secret Staff Member



A Focus on Recall, Retrieval and Quizzing in Lessons:

Over the last few weeks, our students have been experiencing a strong and deliberate focus on recall and retrieval in their lessons. This approach is being supported through the effective use of Showbie assessments and quizzing, helping pupils to strengthen their learning and build long-term memory. What do we mean by recall and retrieval?

Recall and retrieval refer to pupils actively bringing information back to mind that they have previously learned. This might include recalling learning from the previous lesson, last week, or even from an earlier unit of work.

Research shows that regularly retrieving information helps students to strengthen their long-term memory and make learning more secure. Each time students retrieve information, the learning becomes more firmly embedded, making it easier to access in the future.









Quality of Education



Quizzing throughout the lesson:

Showbie assessments, taking place on pupils' iPads, use lowstakes quizzing to assess student prior knowledge. This might involve recalling learning from the previous lesson, last week, or a previous unit.

Quizzing is not limited to the start of lessons. It is used at different points to support learning, including:

- Hinge questions carefully chosen questions asked partway through a lesson to check whether pupils are ready to move on.
- Exit tickets short quizzes or questions completed at the end of a lesson. These help teachers assess understanding across the whole class and use this information to plan the next lesson effectively.

By regularly practising recall and retrieval through Showbie assessments and quizzing, students are developing stronger memories, deeper understanding and greater confidence in their learning.

Well done to all of the students that took part.






















































KSS Lecture Programme

This week, students took part in the second lecture in our KSS lecture programme, exploring the fascinating and secretive world of spies and espionage.








Science


















Year 7 Panto Trip


