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Dear Parents/Carers,

I write to you one final time before the end of the calendar year as a very proud Headteacher! What a year it has been, with so much to celebrate and it is always an opportunity at this point in the calendar to reflect on what we have achieved together.

Firstly, thank you to all of you that completed the recent parent/carer survey, the feedback is as always much appreciated and as valuable as ever. We use your feedback to continue to move the school forwards and to work on any areas or issues that you raise. To see that **97% of parents/carers would recommend the school to another parent or carer** is amazing to see. This sums up the remarkable connection that we have with you all, as we work together to support your child both academically and pastorally. I can assure you that we do not take this support for granted and we will ensure that there is no complacency as we enter 2025.

There has been a conscious shift over the last three years at KSS, to continue to support students pastorally and to know them all as individuals in order to personalise our support but also to relentlessly improve the academic expectations that we have for your child. I am delighted to share that this drive and determination has been recognised nationally. The school is officially the **tenth most improved school in England for our Year 11 outcomes (2024)**. This is testament to the hard work and collective efforts of our school community and is an achievement that we should all be proud of.

A further reflection as we look back on the year are the digital enhancements that we have made through Mrs Weaver and her work in leading our 'Showbie' roll out on our new iPads, that were launched in October. There have been some great strides made in the way that we feedback to students about their learning and how we also make adaptations to support students in completing their secure tasks each lesson.

Finally, the last week has summed up why our staff and students feel so positively about our school. We have held celebration assemblies that encapsulate our achievement culture at KSS. It is a delight to see students recognised for their work in lessons, their contribution to the wider school and for their exceptional attendance and attitudes to learning. This sense of pride was compounded by various other rewards events this week and it culminated with the reward trips, which have been such a highlight. We believe at KSS that students meeting our expectations consistently should always be recognised and we have had a record number of students attend many activities this week. It is not just rewards trips though, yesterday Mrs Hawthorne and Mrs Postlethwaite both led Year 11 trips to support Maths and Health & Social Care studies. This demonstrates once more our relentless and unwavering focus upon academic success.



Wow, what a busy term we have had in Maths! Students in year 7 have used a mixture of physical and digital manipulatives to learn about calculating with positive and negative numbers.

All year groups took full advantage of the revision materials in Sparx to prepare for their assessments this term. All students in year 7, 8, 9 and 11 now have access to personalised follow-up material in Sparx to fix fluency gaps in their understanding and many have already started on this once they've completed their Sparx homework.

Students in key stage 3 have been using Sparx to practise and improve their times tables knowledge. To complement the excellent 'drop everything and read' initiative the maths department have been getting students to 'stop everything and times' in their lessons to ensure all students have full knowledge of times table facts, helping to build confidence in maths lessons. It's really pleasing to see that since September 97 students have already improved their times table knowledge and fluency!






















What is my child learning?

When Ofsted visited the school last year they were impressed with our subject curriculums and how the students were taught the key themes.







Spanish




Last week we held personalised meetings with all students in Year 11 where they received their Mock exam results. During these meetings we celebrated successes and discussed further support needed by individual students.




House Points

- Full engagement and effort during lessons


































































































































It is always a highlight of the term and what a brilliant showcase of our students amazing achievements.

Well done to every student that received a certificate and a subject badge.


