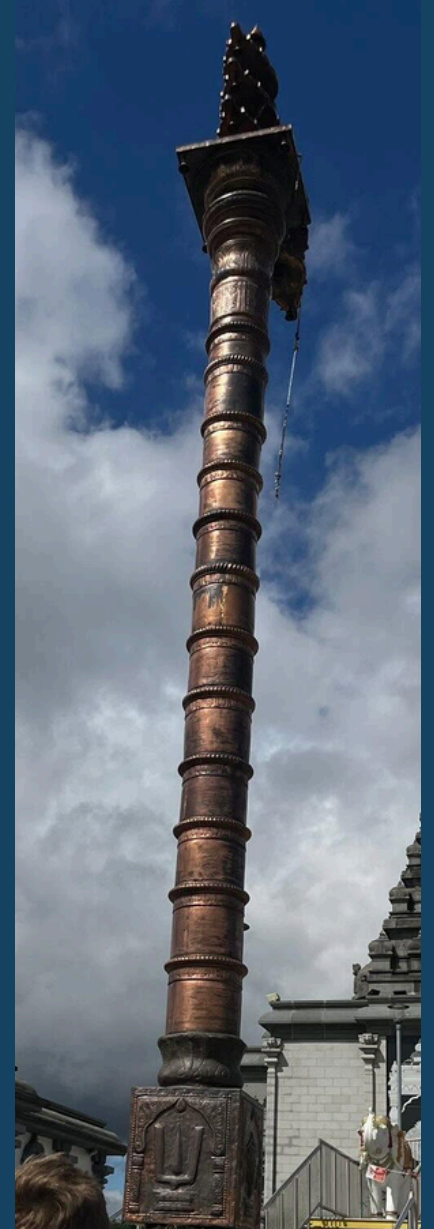
Year 7 Religious Studies Trip

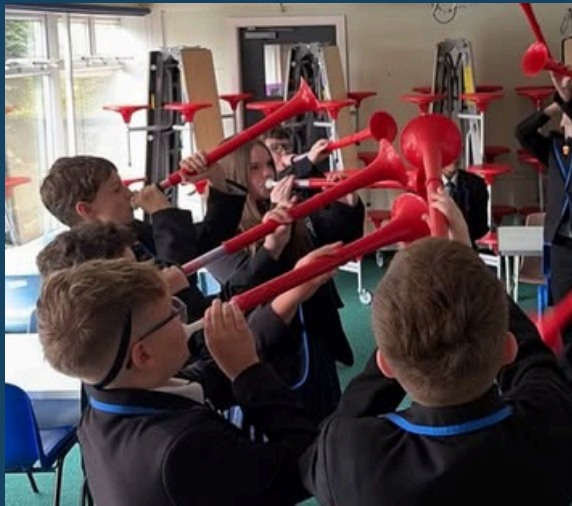
Music

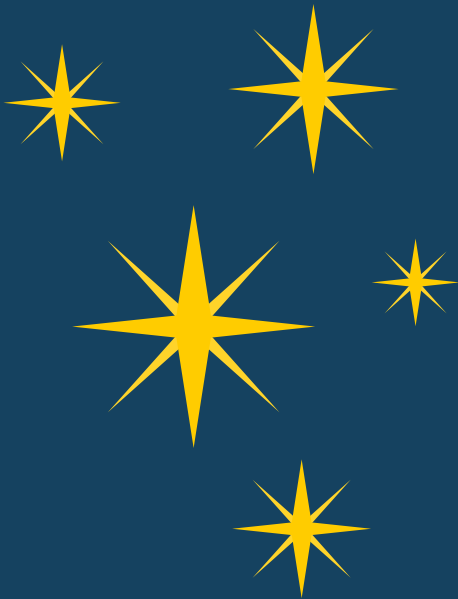

Quality of Education

At Kidsgrove Secondary School, we are committed to ensuring that every student receives a high-quality education that enables them to know more, remember more and achieve their full potential. Throughout this year, we have continued to strengthen teaching and learning across the school through a range of evidence-informed approaches designed to support student success.

A Consistent Approach to Learning

All lessons are structured around our Learning Steps model, providing a clear and consistent framework for learning. This helps students to:

- Build knowledge over time.
- Develop deeper understanding of key concepts.
- Make connections between new and prior learning.
- Grow in confidence and independence.

By ensuring consistency across classrooms, students know what to expect and can focus fully on their learning.

Supporting Success Through Effective Teaching

This year, we have focused on several key teaching strategies that help students access ambitious learning and make strong progress.

Scaffolding Learning

Teachers carefully plan support to help students tackle challenging tasks successfully. This may include:

- Breaking tasks into manageable steps.
- Providing writing frames or sentence starters.
- Using visual prompts and guided examples.
- Offering structured support before students work independently.

Importantly, scaffolding does not lower expectations. Instead, it helps all students, including those with additional needs, access the same ambitious curriculum and develop greater independence over time.

Quality of Education

A further area of focus has been the use of live modelling in lessons. Live modelling allows teachers to demonstrate expert thinking in real time, showing students exactly how to approach a task or construct a high-quality response. By making the thinking process visible, teachers can:

- Demonstrate what success looks like.
- Break down complex tasks into clear steps.
- Address misconceptions immediately.
- Build pupils' confidence when tackling challenging work.

This approach has been particularly effective in supporting students with extended writing and problem-solving across a range of subjects.

Dual Coding

Teachers have also continued to develop the use of dual coding across the curriculum.

Dual coding combines words and visuals to support learning. Examples include:

- Diagrams and illustrations.
- Timelines and flow charts.
- Graphic organisers.
- Visual models and worked examples.

Research shows that combining visual and verbal information helps students understand complex concepts more easily and strengthens long-term memory.

Strengthening Memory Through Retrieval Practice

Another important focus has been retrieval practice, helping pupils to revisit and recall previously learned knowledge.

Through regular retrieval activities and the use of Showbie assessments, students are encouraged to actively recall information from memory rather than simply re-reading it.

This helps students to:

- Strengthen long-term retention.
- Identify gaps in their understanding.
- Improve recall during assessments and examinations.
- Build confidence in what they know.





Homework club

Homework Club provides a quiet, supportive space for students to complete homework, revise, or catch up on classwork. Staff are available to offer guidance, help with organisation, and support students in developing positive independent study habits. All students are welcome.

Developing Vocabulary Across the Curriculum

One of our key priorities moving forward is the explicit teaching of vocabulary in every lesson, across every subject.

Strong vocabulary knowledge is one of the biggest contributors to academic success. By explicitly teaching subject-specific language, we help students to:

- Access more challenging texts.
- Understand complex ideas.
- Communicate their thinking with greater precision.
- Write more effectively across all subjects.

Vocabulary development is not just important in English; it is essential for success in every area of the curriculum.

Looking Ahead to September

When we return in September, our next major focus will be developing students' confidence, resilience and independence when completing extended writing tasks. Extended writing plays a vital role across many subjects and year groups and is an important component of examination success.

Our focus will be on helping students to:

- Think carefully before they write.
- Plan and organise their ideas effectively.
- Write in greater depth and detail.
- Develop confidence when tackling challenging tasks independently.
- Persevere when faced with difficult questions.

By strengthening these skills, we aim to ensure that students are fully prepared for future examinations while also developing the critical thinking, communication and resilience needed for success beyond school.

We are proud of the progress made this year and look forward to continuing our journey of improvement, ensuring every student receives the very best educational experience possible.



English

This term, Year 7 students have been exploring the exciting world of creative writing in English, and the results have been nothing short of impressive. From their very first lessons, students have shown enthusiasm, imagination and a willingness to experiment with language, demonstrating just how quickly confidence can grow when creativity is encouraged.

Students began by developing their descriptive writing skills, using vivid imagery to bring settings to life. Whether describing a barren desert, a mysterious forest or a bustling cityscape, they have been taught how to carefully select language to create atmosphere and engage their reader. A particular focus has been placed on the use of ambitious vocabulary and a range of sentence structures, helping students to craft writing that is both technically accurate and engaging to read.



English

As part of this unit, students have also explored how to structure their writing effectively. They have learned how to build a clear sense of progression within a paragraph, guiding the reader through their ideas with increasing control and confidence. Teachers have supported students in experimenting with different sentence types, including simple, compound and complex sentences, as well as more advanced forms such as embedded clauses. This has enabled students to add depth and sophistication to their work.

Another key focus has been the use of figurative language. Students have enthusiastically experimented with techniques such as simile, metaphor and personification to enhance their descriptions. It has been particularly pleasing to see students taking risks with their writing, trying out new ideas and developing their own unique style. Many students have produced highly imaginative pieces, with confident use of language to convey mood and tone.

Teachers have been extremely impressed with the effort and resilience shown by Year 7 throughout this unit. Students have responded positively to feedback and have shown a real commitment to improving their work through drafting and editing. It has been particularly rewarding to see students take pride in their writing and share their work with others. We are very proud of the strong start Year 7 have made in English this year. Their creativity, engagement and determination set a fantastic foundation for future learning, and we look forward to seeing how their writing continues to develop over time.
