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Dear Parents/Carers,

The Christmas break is almost up on us but before we end the term with festivities in the final couple of days it is very much business as usual at KSS.

The Year 11 students are now halfway through their mock examinations and the rest of the student body are engaged in learning activities to support their progress. We were visited by 'Zoo2U' this week in Geography and there have been other exciting lessons in a range of subjects, such as in Food technology, Art, Maths and Science.

This term has seen a real push in the use of 'no hands up' questioning in lessons which supports all students being able to demonstrate their understanding and knowledge. Mrs Weaver and I have been completing lesson observations and learning walks over the past few weeks and the quality of student work continues to improve and impress us greatly.

Thank you to the parents/carers who have completed the latest questionnaire about the provision at the school, we rely on this feedback to improve. The next focus for myself and colleagues at the school post-Christmas will be to look at key stage three data and how this is displayed to demonstrate student progress, which Mrs Weaver will be leading.

In terms of attendance, which has been a real focus over the last seven weeks, I am pleased to report that there are very positive signs. We had 142 students achieve 100% attendance in November, which demonstrates incredible resilience. We have also launched our '12 Days of Christmas Challenge' and it is exciting to see which students have been randomly selected each day for a daily attendance prize from Mrs Hume. In addition, I am also delighted to share that we have a large proportion of students that have qualified for our Christmas reward trip on the 9th of December.

Finally, as always, thank you for your continued support. We have had an excellent response to the vacancy for a parent governor to join the newly formed KSS 'Executive Academy Council', chaired by Mr Duffy. We have five prospective volunteers that have applied, and we will be holding an election after Christmas to determine the outcome. This demonstrates the fantastic links with parents/carers that are forming.

The students have also selected their film choice through a digital survey which will be 'Black Panther, Wakanda Forever'.


















House Update


Attendance

A message from Mrs Weaver...


A big thanks to Zoo2u for visiting our Y8 and Y10 Geographers.


A message from Mrs Postlethwaite...
