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Dear Parents/Carers,

As we complete the third week of 2026, it is a great opportunity to reflect upon the start to of the year. Following the early snowy disruption, we have been full steam ahead with an action packed three weeks.

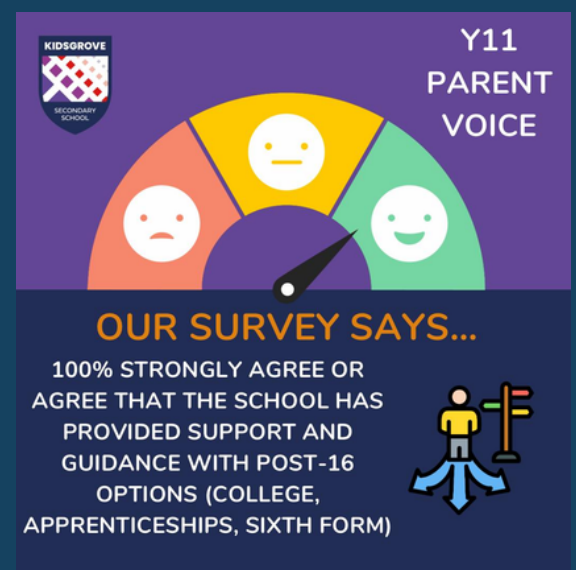
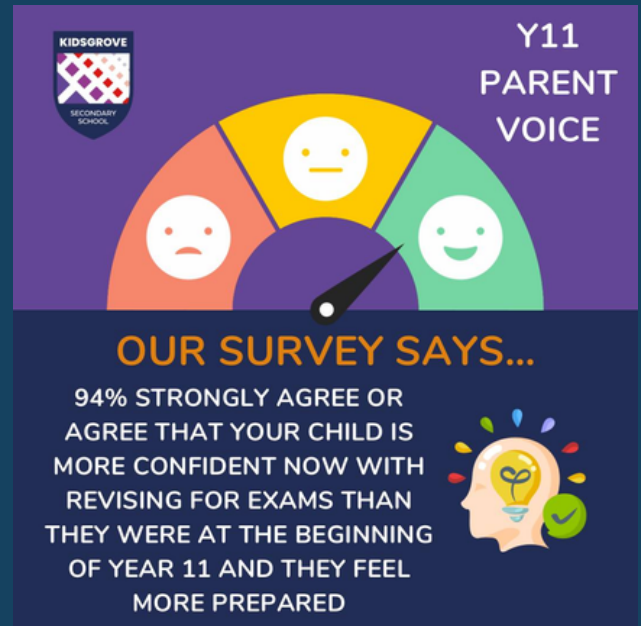
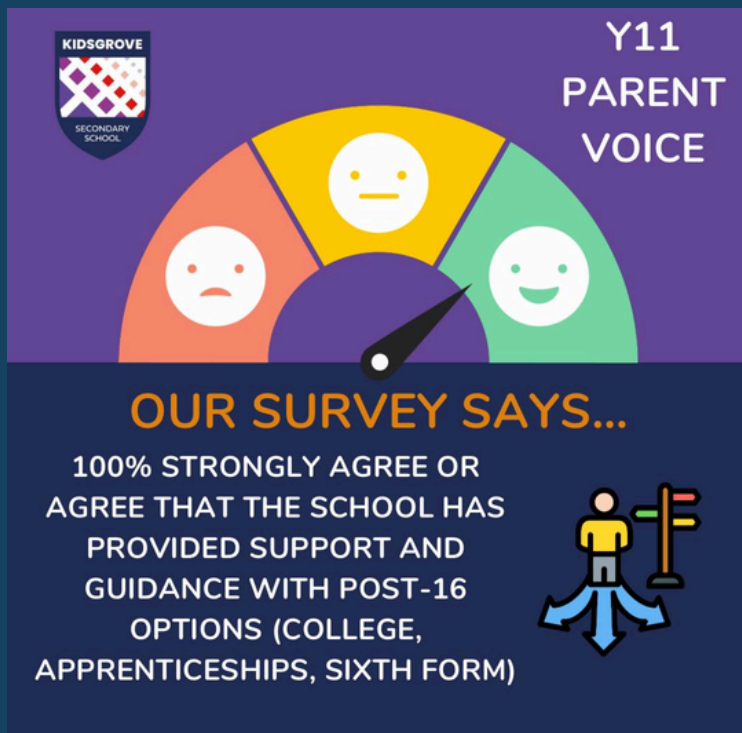
# Year 11 Parents Evening

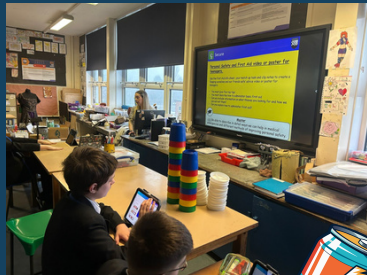


# Enrichment Day

- Your final session will be based around identifying your personal skills and which are considered strengths and areas of development.

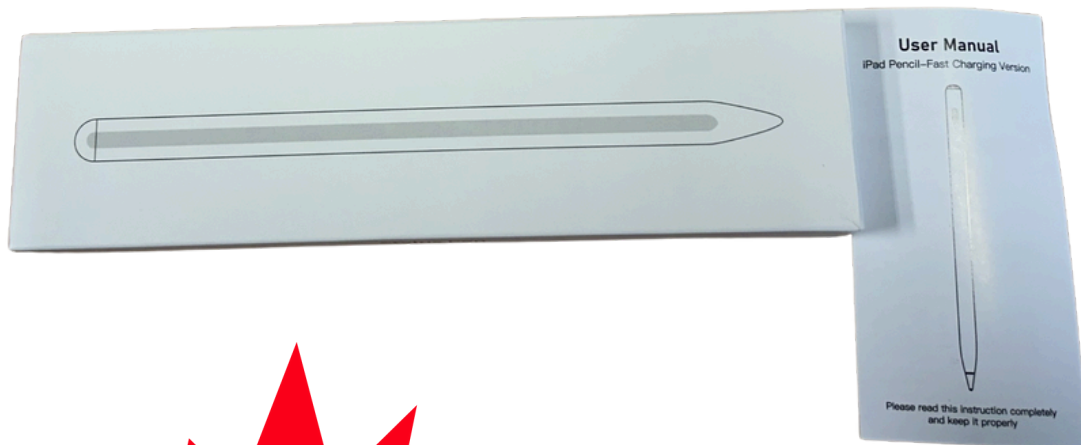
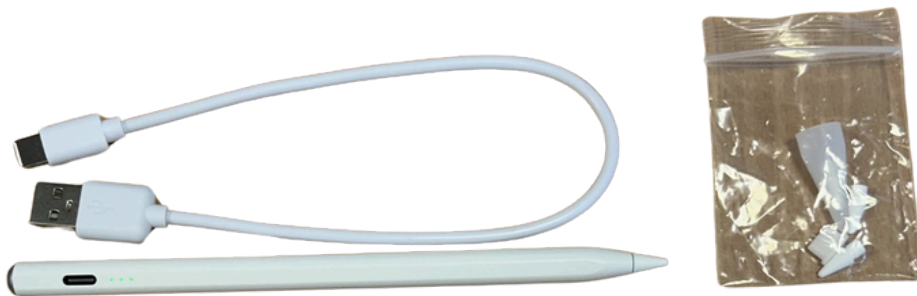

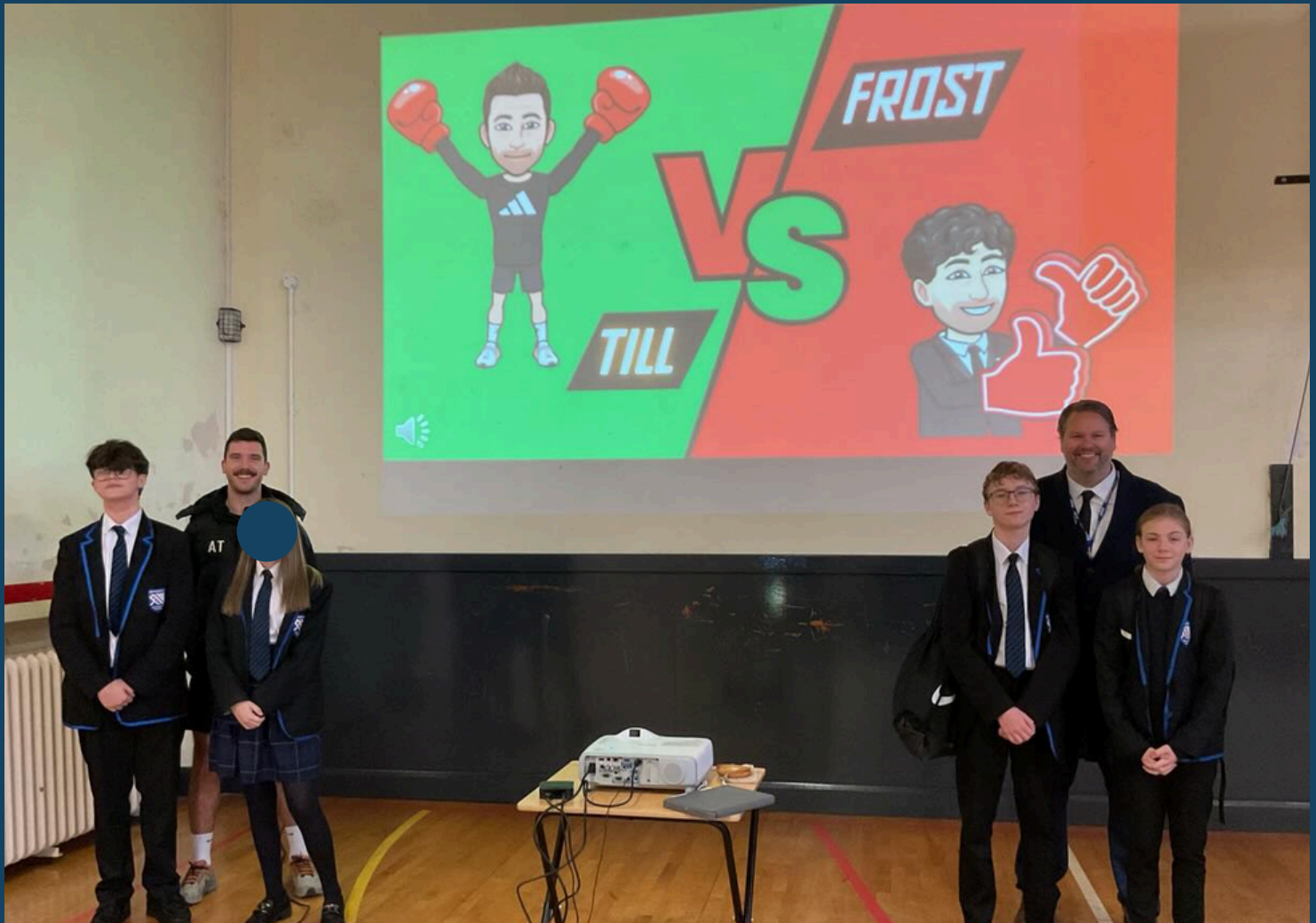
# FROST V TILL

Each week brings a new challenge, with opportunities to score points through:





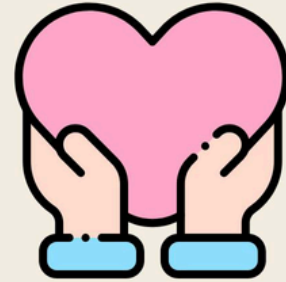

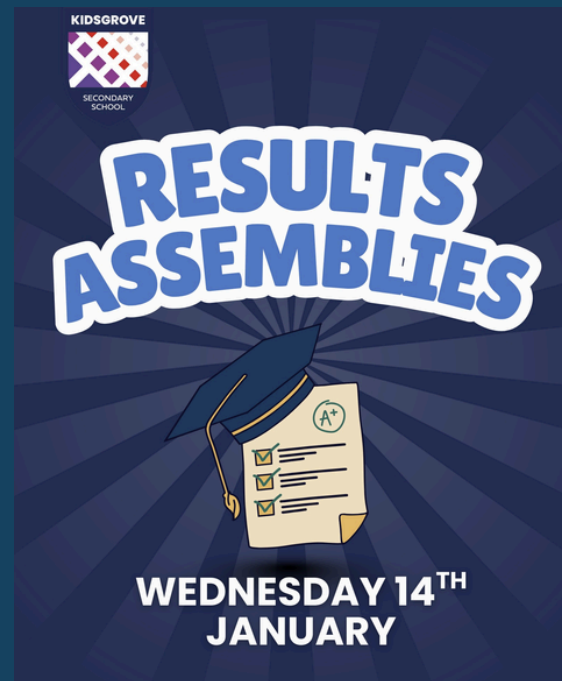

# Quality of Education



Since returning to school this term, students across all year groups have settled back into routines extremely well. To support this strong start, there has been a clear whole-school focus on the presentation of work, with particular emphasis on the accuracy of spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG). These routines help students to approach their learning with care, confidence, and pride across all subjects.

## Consistency:

To ensure SPaG remains a priority in every lesson and every classroom:

- All lessons include a clear SPaG symbol to remind students to check their spelling, punctuation, and grammar.
- Every classroom displays a SPaG reminder poster to reinforce expectations consistently across the school.
- Weekly lesson drop-ins and regular book looks show that students are responding well and ensuring SPaG remains a focus in their day-to-day learning.

## Why SPaG matters:

Strong presentation and accuracy are essential across the curriculum, particularly as students progress towards GCSE study. Many subjects award valuable marks for accuracy, including:

- Correct use of capital letters.
- Accurate spelling of key subject terminology.
- A range of appropriate punctuation.

Developing these habits early ensures students are well prepared for assessments in all subject areas.

Linking SPaG to our Literacy Strategy:

As part of our wider Quality of Education focus on literacy, including reading fluency and the use of sophisticated vocabulary to deepen meaning and understanding, this emphasis on SPaG is helping pupils to:

- Take pride in the presentation of their work.
- Proofread carefully and routinely.
- Develop strong checking habits for all completed tasks.
- Ensure work reflects the high standards expected across the school.

Preparing Students for Assessment:

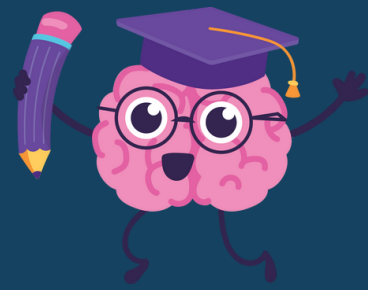
By reinforcing these expectations in every classroom, pupils are increasingly seeing accuracy as a core part of learning rather than an added extra. This approach:

- Builds independence and confidence.
- Encourages pupils to take ownership of their work.
- Prepares them effectively for internal performance assessments and public examinations.

# House Points

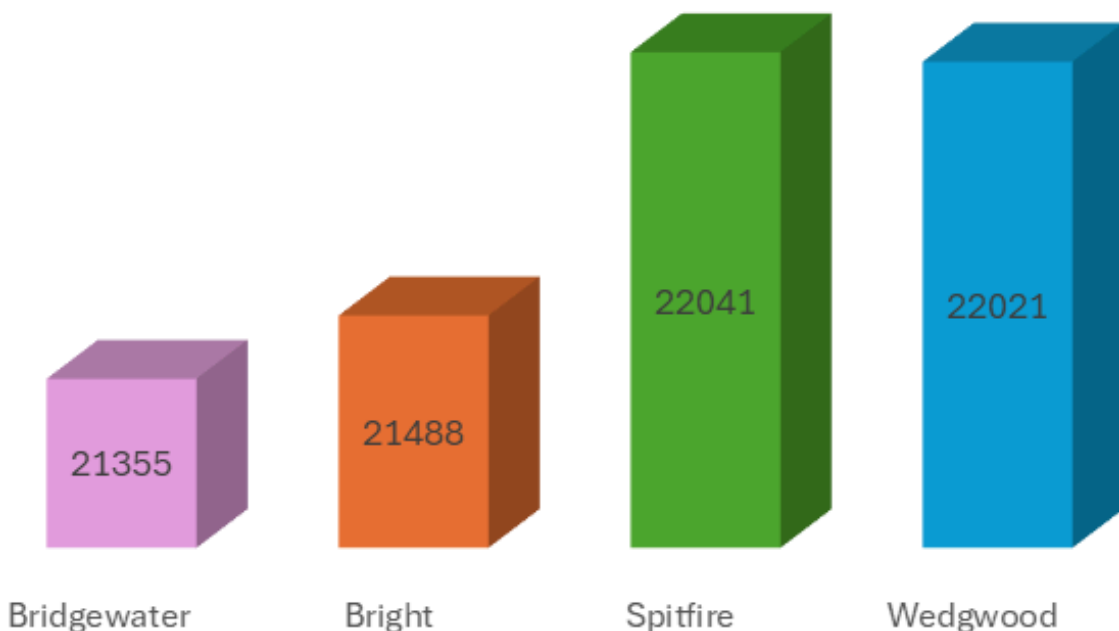
A big well done to all of our students for their continued effort in earning House Points across the school. The current totals show some fantastic competition between our houses:

Total House Points

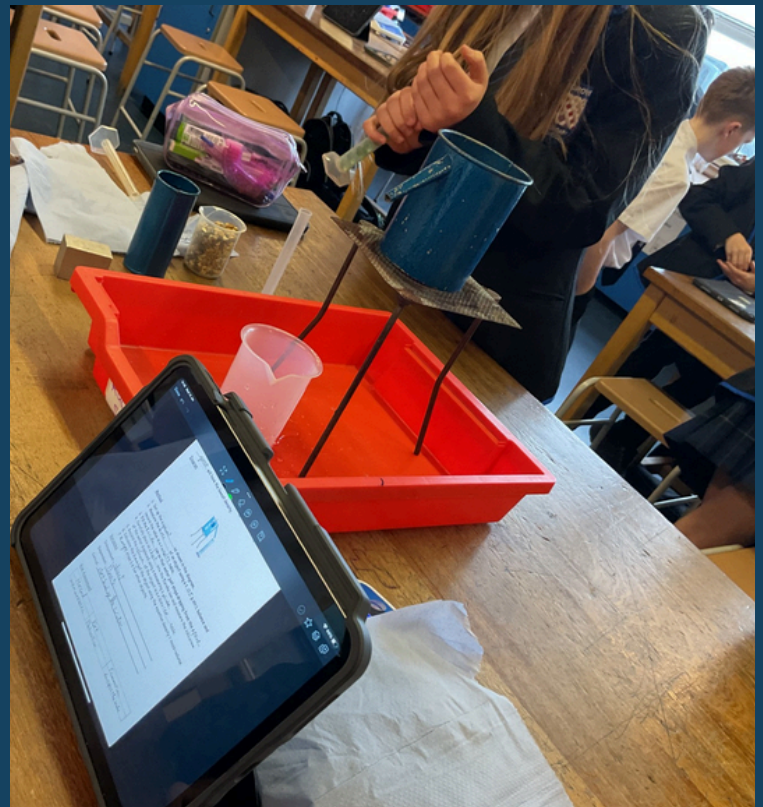




# Science

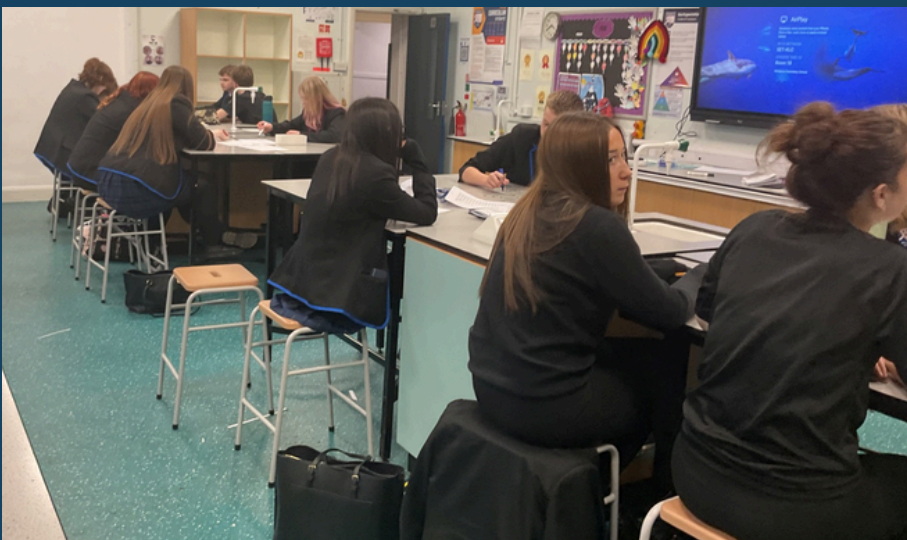


# Science

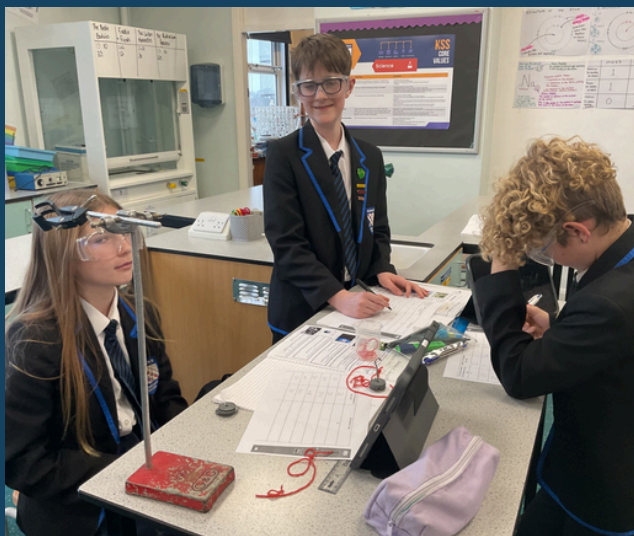
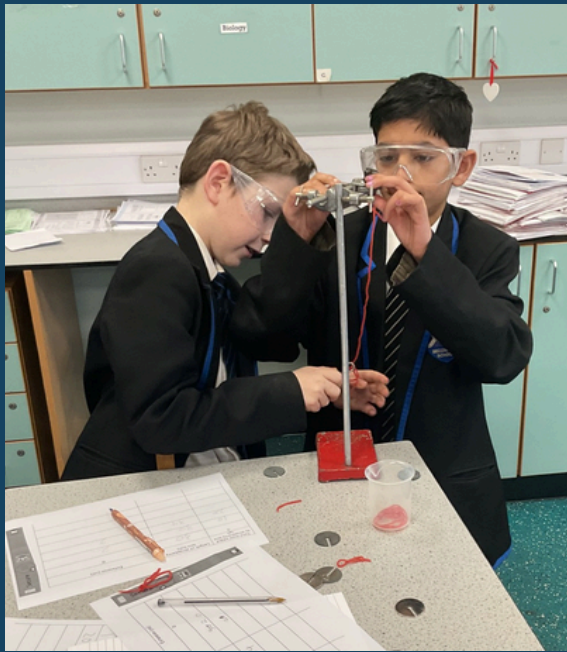
# Science

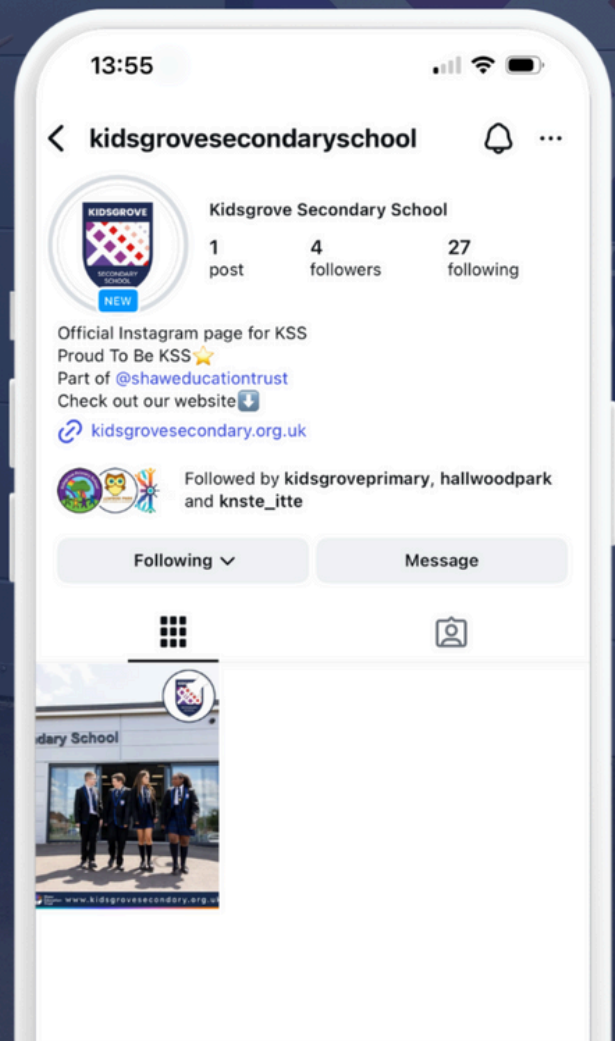

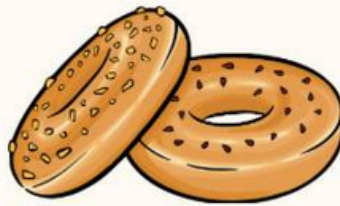
