
# House Update

Our next Enrichment day is in January and we have lots in the pipeline. We are looking forward to working with lots of external providers to deliver more meaningful sessions. Watch this space!










## Year 11


# **Young Carer Champion**

Thank you to BAE Systems, RAF and Royal Navy Education for this inspiring and engaging visit.










OI would like to introduce you to a new member of staff that has joined the KSS team.

Miss Longmore has joined us as one of our teaching assistant team. She works with students in classrooms and also with students one to one, supporting with reading and literacy skills.


