
Thank you to all 140 parents & carers that completed the recent feedback survey about parents evenings.










# Half term Intervention

Well done to all teams that took part and thank to Mr Gillespie and Mr Allen for supporting the event.









#### Y10 ESports @ Newcastle College

The Esports Extravaganza was a wonderful event designed to bring together students from across the district for a day of information and friendly competition. Held at Newcastle College, the event featured various esports activities, engaging workshops, and experienced group leaders, with the Rocket League competition being the highlight of the day.

After a brief introduction, the day was split into 3 segments:

- 1.Understanding character design and using specialist websites to design a character fit for purpose.
- 2.Understanding and learning the mechanics of Rocket League ready to compete in the preliminary rounds of the competition
- 3.Using initiative to understand 'Overwatch' and 'League of Legends' as our specialists wanted the students to experience the games without too much exposition allowing for free exploration.

Following the students experiencing all given activities; the day ended with the finals of the Rocket League competition in which 2 students from Kidsgrove (and one student from Ormiston) battle against a team of Ormiston students and were sadly knocked down at the final hurdle.

I was really impressed with the students' engagement; tenacity at new challenges and interest in a world they hadn't seen before.


















#### **Enrichment Day**

Key stage four Hospitality and Catering students have been perfecting their skills in bread making, no cook cheesecakes and pancakes.
































# Personal Development










# Art - Robots








### Computing








When Ofsted visited the school last year they were impressed with our subject curriculums and how the students were taught the key themes.


