When Ofsted visited the school last year they were impressed with our subject curriculums and how the students were taught the key themes.



House Points


The total house points so far are below.

Everyone can contribute to their house team's score!




























Careers at KSS

We are a member of Stoke on Trent and Staffordshire Careers Hub and work with local businesses and employers and our community to ensure our students have access to a wide range of experiences.


We have been doing a lot of work around raising awareness of our local Labour Market Information (LMI) and the Employer Competency Framework (ECF) with students. This develops their knowledge of employment growth areas in our local region, and what skills employers value.
