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Dear Parents/Carers,

What a year it has been at KSS! It has been 38 weeks of learning, personal development and progress from all of our students and we look back at the last nine months with great pride at what the students have achieved.

This has been a record breaking year for so many reasons. but the most exciting development is the fact that we have a record number of Year 7 students joining us in September. We cannot wait to welcome our new intake and immerse them into our collective KSS family.

The end of term is tinged with sadness but also gratitude as we say goodbye to valued KSS staff.

Mrs Beardmore is retiring as our exams officer and operations lead after many years of dutiful service to the school, she will be greatly missed by all of us. Mrs McDermott is also retiring as teacher of Maths after two years of dedicated work in helping to transform the Maths department, she has made a terrific impact on the students she has taught. Mrs Evans leaves us after seven years to join another school as a teacher of music and she will be a great loss to our KSS family. Mr Baldwin also leaves us having been a key member of the English department over the last two years. He has been a key Year II form tutor and has also offered his own time to inspire our students to play chess, of which we now have a group of chess experts. Finally, we say goodbye to Mrs Hume who many of you will know has supported a number of families and students in her role as attendance officer and as deputy safeguarding lead, she leaves us for a promotion working across a trust in the north west of England.

In light of these staffing changes, over the last few months, the school has been busily committed to recruiting exceptional staff to join our staff team. I am delighted to share that we have a number of colleagues joining us in September.

We have Ms Wagstaff joining us as teacher of Performing Arts from a Cheshire school, Mrs Price as teacher of Maths from a school in Stoke-on-Trent and Mrs Hawthorne who has joined as Associate Assistant Headteacher of Maths from her previous role as a national Maths leader. We also have Ms Weston joining the team as teacher of English with KSS being her first teaching post. Mrs Longmore is joining the inclusion support team as a Teaching Assistant,

Ms Tipping-Brown has been appointed as our new technology technician and Ms Johnson is joining us as our new Receptionist.

These new appointments are in conjunction with a few internal staffing changes. Mrs Frost has stepped down as the Maths subject lead after two years of exceptional leadership but will remain with us as teacher of Maths. Mr Old has been successful in becoming our new Associate Assistant Headteacher for English, where he will be leading all things literacy related. Mr Till has become our new Senior Assistant Headteacher, leading behaviour and attendance from September which sees Mrs Postlethwaite become our new Quality of Education lead. In light of Mr Till's promotion, Miss Hambleton will take up the post of SENCO in September. We are also delighted to share that Ms Potts has been promoted for her exceptional work over the last two years to become our new Attendance Officer and Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead.

Although there are lots of changes, what remains is the amazing culture and relationships that we have as a school community and we cannot wait for the new academic year to begin. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you as parents/carers for your continued support over the year.






Fundraising

STEM Challenge

On Tuesday 9 July 2024, Miss Wood and eight Year 10 students visited St Margaret Ward Catholic Academy to represent Science at Kidsgrove Secondary School in a STEM Challenge Day.


The day involved a Physics Challenge to build and float a boat using a few supplies of materials, a Chemistry Challenge to identify the strongest and weakest acids from a selection of unlabelled chemicals, a Maths Challenge which involved completing a relay race using answers to mathematical questions and a Biology Challenge to extract human cheek cells and then draw the cells accurately. Our students, in two teams of four, worked effectively to tight deadlines throughout the day against Year 10 students from The Hayward Academy, St Margaret Ward Catholic Academy and Excel Academy.

Well done to Lilly, Fox, Ryan, Alfie (Team K) and Maisie, Macy, Mason, Josh (Team S) who behaved impeccably throughout the day, demonstrated fantastic STEM and teamwork skills, looked incredibly smart and embraced a very exciting day.

At the end of the afternoon, the points from both teams were added together to reveal that Kidsgrove Secondary had narrowly missed out on the winning position by two points, achieved

by Haywood Academy!
















Uniform Expectations






Keele Residential

Well done to all students that were celebrated.

























































House Winner
