Core Value	Meaning	Examples
Leadership	The ability of an individual or a group of individuals to influence and guide followers towards a common goal.	 KS3 Art Monitor role. KS4 Leading working groups.
Organisation	The way in which something is done or arranged.	 Ensuring you have the correct drawing equipment. Preparing and clearing practical materials. Organising your folders and work appropriatelyand effectively.
Resilience	The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties.	 Having the ability to try new materials with a positive mindset. Coping with failure and trying again. To respond to constructive comments practicing a growth mindset. Having high expectations of effort and presentation.
Initiative	Doing things without being told; you find out what you need to know; you keep going when things get tough; and you spot and take advantage of opportunities that others pass by. You act, instead of reacting.	 Showing confidence in own design choices. Getting appropriate materials to support the current task. Completing additional practice of difficult techniques to develop dexterity. Visiting galleries and other artistic venues to strengthen subject knowledge. Attending Art Club. Identifying key students to look for support.
Communication	The art of sharing meaningful information with others.	 Skill share with other students. Encoraging other students during new or difficult activities. Discussing project ideas with others to build ideas and develop depth of exploration.
