Core Value	Meaning	Examples
Leadership	The ability of an individual or a group of individuals to influence and guide followers towards a common goal.	 By leading debates on historical subjects. By acting as a mentor to help guide peers through certain topics.
Organisation	The way in which something is done or arranged.	 By evaluating causes and consequences and arranging them rationally in order of significance. By organising yourselves into groups for collaborative work.
Resilience	The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties.	 Showing a determination to progress when faced with difficult extended writing tasks. Realising that progress does not always come quickly in History and does need focus and endeavour. Having a continued positive mindset Having high aspirations
Initiative	Doing things without being told; you find out what you need to know; you keep going when things get tough; and you spot and take advantage of opportunities that others pass by. You act, instead of reacting.	 Being able to work independently and trusting your own judgement. Being self motivated. Asking when you need help or have finished your task. Helping others who are struggling with a skill
Communication	The art of sharing meaningful information with others.	 Being able to verbalise complex concepts in historical debates. Expressing yourself clearly and rationally when talking about history. Listening to others. Being able to work and communicate effectively during group work.
