Upcoming Events For Families

<u>27th February - Year R Bikeability:</u> Please ensure your child has their bike, helmet and suitable clothes for the weather with them for the course. This course is only for those children who have been signed up for the training.

27th February – Year 1 & Year 3 'Chance to Shine' Cricket Coaching: Children in Year 1 and Year 3 will be working with a specialist coach to develop their cricket skills. Please ensure your child's PE kit is in school and has warm clothing in the case of cooler temperatures.

<u>28th February – Year 5 NSPCC Workshop:</u> The NSPCC will be working with children in Year 5 about personal safety. This is a free activity and will take place during the school day.

1st March – Year 6 NSPCC Workshop: The NSPCC will be working with children in Year 6 about personal safety. This is a free activity and will take place during the school day.

<u>2nd March – World Book Day:</u> Children across the school are invited to dress up as their favourite book character and bring their favourite book to school. This is a free event but donations will be collected by the Reading Ministry to put towards buying new books for our reading corners in school. If your child would feel more comfortable in their pyjamas or their school uniform, please allow them to wear this on the day. There will be a special menu for school meals on World Book Day; the menu will be shared on ParentMail.

Curriculum Update

Nursery

During this half term, our curriculum will focus on 'Bugs'. We hope the children will enjoy learning about different bugs and their habitats, as well as beginning to understand the need to care for all living creatures. As part of this curriculum focus, we will be introducing key texts such as 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson, 'The Very Busy Spider' by Eric Carle and 'Snail Trail' by Ruth Brown. In addition to this we will also be looking at reference books to support our learning.

Reception



This half term our theme is 'Dinosaurs, Eggs and Fossils'. We already know that our children love dinosaurs so we are really looking forward to learning more about them. The first book we are going to be reading in English is 'If I had a Dinosaur'. I wonder what you would do if you had a dinosaur at home?

In Maths we are continuing to explore the properties of shapes. We have already learned about circles and triangles. We are now moving on to learning about quadrilaterals. We are continuing to learn

about the composition of numbers up to 10 and use our tens frames to help us with this. Later this half term, we will be starting to learn about maps and the space around us.

Our handwriting is improving considerably and we are really proud of the children and their progress in this area. This half term we will be moving on to handwriting on paper and using a pencil. You can help your child to improve their writing by practising writing their name in the pre-cursive font. All the children have brought home a name card showing how their name is written. If you have any questions about this please ask.

Year 1



This half term our cross-curricular topic will be 'Map it Out' and 'Animals Including Humans'. In English, we will be learning mapping skills with a focus on the book 'Follow that Map'. We will also be learning all about the 'The Jolly Postman' and will be focusing on letter writing. The book 'Follow that Map' also links to our Geography topic where we will be learning about fieldwork mapping.

In Maths, we will be exploring measurement: length and height, mass and weight, capacity and volume. We will also continue our work on addition and subtraction.

'Animals including humans' is our Science focus. We will be identifying, naming drawing and labelling the basic parts of the human body and will learn all about the senses. In P.S.H.E., as part of this topic, we will be learning about the main external parts of the bodies of humans, including names for sexual parts. We will be learning about how to keep ourselves clean.

In P.E., during the half term, we will be learning skills used in cricket and gymnastics and, in Art, we will be exploring clay and making pinch and coil pots.

Year 2



This term we will be focusing on adventure stories written by Julia Donaldson in English, starting with 'The Snail and the Whale'. In Maths, we will learn about number and place value, measure, mass, capacity and volume. We will use our knowledge of addition and subtraction within these strands as well. Our Science topic will continue to focus on living things and habitats, learning about adaptation and food chains. In Geography, we

will learn about UK coasts, holidays and weather with a focus on our experiences of Hunstanton. In Art, we will design, create and evaluate 3D sea creature clay sculptures. We will learn about the Christian festival of Easter in our R.E. lessons and in P.S.H.E., we will learn about drugs education. In P.E., we will play a range of invasion games as well as play dry water safety games. In music, we will learn about reggae music with a focus on animals.

Year 3



In Year 3, we will be looking at the book 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl. We will be using this to support our learning of playscripts, before moving onto narrative writing. In our Maths work, we will begin with Geometry and recapping our knowledge and understanding of 2D and 3D shapes. In Science, we will continue our learning on plants where we will plant and observe the growth of a bean. Our Geography lessons will continue to look at the water cycle, with a focus on how

this affects water locally (in the Fens). We will be using this knowledge to support our Design Technology work where we will be using mechanisms to create a moving explanation book about the water cycle. Through our R.E. topic, we will be looking at the Easter story. In Computing, we will be using online programs to create branching databases. In French, we will continue to learn the names of different musical instruments. In P.E., we will be working with a cricket coach to develop our bowling, catching and hitting skills, as well as working on our teambuilding skills through a variety of games and activities. In our Music lessons, we will be learning and practising our songs for the Year 3, 4 and 5 performance. We can't wait to share it with you!

Year 4



This half term, we are starting our new topic of Myths and Legends in English. We are going to be reading a range of Viking myths and legends from a book called 'The Dragon's Hoard' and by the end of the topic, the children will have written one of their own. In Geography, we are learning about settlements and land use, linking to our previous History topic on the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. The knowledge we will gain from the trip to West Stow will support this. We will also be finishing off our work on Viking invasions from last term.

In Maths, we will be revisiting place value, focusing on rounding and negative numbers. We will also be practising our times tables to support us in our learning. In Science, we are beginning our topic on Animals, Including Humans, where we will explore how food chains are created and how our digestive systems work.

In P.S.H.E., we will be looking at how to manage money and, in R.E., we are continuing our topic on Hinduism. The children will be learning about the stories of the different Gods and Goddesses, and how Hindus use these during their worship. In P.E., we are continuing with our Swimming lessons and the children will be starting a unit on dance.

Computing will be about data collection and ways to display and understand the information we have gathered. For our Art topic this term, we are going to be investigating different methods of printing Celtic designs onto different media. Finally, we will be learning the French version of Goldilocks in our languages lessons.

Year 5



This half term, our Geography topic is 'Online Mapping of Mesoamerica'. We will be building on our knowledge of the Maya and using it to explore the land formation of Mesoamerica including the features of the land. In D.T. we will be using our knowledge of the Maya to design and create a Mayan feast.

In Science, we will be exploring the properties and changes of materials. We will be

experimenting the impact of the properties of different materials and separating different mixtures of materials using sieving, filtration, evaporation and magnetism.

Our R.E. topic will be continuing with Buddhism. We will be focussing on our emotions in P.S.H.E., including thinking about boredom, worries and stress and strategies we can use to overcome these. Our French topic will be habitats, where we will learn the names of different habitats as well as the different animals located in those habitats. In Computing, we will be learning about online databases.

We will be reading 'The Great Kapok Tree' in English and completing a range of writing pieces upon this. Finally, in Maths we will be learning about negative numbers, Roman numerals and shapes including angles, area and perimeter.

Year 6



This half term, the children in Year 6 will continue their topic on the Victorians and Trade. Using the story 'Street Child', based on the real life story of Jim Jarvis, we will be writing recounts and narratives. In maths, we will continue our work on the four operations alongside work on ratio, the properties of shape and position and direction. In science, we will be continuing our work on Evolution, including researching Mary Anning and exploring how fossils are used

to support research on evolution.

Our D.T. unit of work will link to our Victorians and Trade topic, where the children will be making vehicles to transport goods in Victorian times. Our R.E. focus will be on Christianity and how the Bible supports Christians to follow their moral compass. P.S.H.E. will enable us to learning about money and how to save and budget appropriately. We will be using Excel in computing to explore how to use a spreadsheet including inputting formulas. In P.E., our topics are tennis and gymnastics. P.E. days will continue to be a Thursday and Friday.
