




EARLY YEARS - LITTLE RED HEN






YEAR 2 - DISCOVER THE MAGIC OF YEAR TWO'S VAMPIRE DRAGON!

YEAR 3 HAVE DISCOVERED A NEW DRAGON!

This week in English, Year 3 have taken inspiration from the exciting Rainbow Dragon text to invent a fearsome new creature — the mysterious Shadow Dragon! The children have let their imaginations soar, carefully drawing and labelling their dragons with all sorts of fascinating features. From shimmering black scales to wings that melt into the night sky. They also explored where their dragons might live and what they might eat. Next week, we'll be turning all this creative thinking into our very own non-fiction information texts. We can't wait to see how Year 3 bring their creatures to life through writing!





YEAR 4 - THE EMBERSTORM DRAGON

This week, Year 4 have been diving further into the world of dragons! After exploring the fiery Emberstorm Dragon, the children designed their own versions. They thought carefully about their dragon's appearance, where it lives, what it eats and how it behaves. They brought their ideas to life through detailed drawings, organised their thoughts using a boxing-up plan and have started writing their descriptive information texts. As they write, they will be including generalisers, addition linking words and emotive fronted adverbials to add flair and cohesion to their work. Once this piece is completed, we will be moving on to inventing our own mythical creatures!







YEAR 5 - TREE GIANTS

This half term we have been looking at information texts – Tree Giants. We have spent time learning our model text finding out about the appearance of males and females, their diet, their habitat and a special trait. This week we have been innovating the model to be about a werewolf. They have thought carefully how they can draw the reader's attention, talk like an expert and build a picture in the readers mind. We have learnt

that we can do all of those things by using compound adjectives, generalisers, fronted adverbials and superlatives. We are looking forward to our independent write where we will be discussing vampires, zombies, mermaids or unicorns.



YEAR 6 - TALK 4 WRITING

Year 6 have been enjoying using Talk 4 Writing to explore different texts and write their own pieces based on what they have studied. They particularly enjoyed writing their own stories based on 'The Catch'. After watching a short video clip with no dialogue, the children explored different techniques to build suspense and wrote their own narratives for the story. They then used this to inspire their own independent writing.

These will then go into colourful hampers to be raffled off at a later date. Thank you, we appreciate all of your support.







