

FOCUS ON BOOKS

There are so many new books released every month that we thought it would be nice to share some recommendations from the Book Trust with you:











EARLY YEARS

This half term in PE reception and nursery children will be practising races in preparation for their first sports day at Kingsfield. We will be practising bean bag throwing, obstacle races, egg and spoon race, javelin, hurdles, standing long jump and sprinting races!





Year 1 have been thoroughly enjoying PE this term. We have been learning how to do gymnastics, play invasion games and also multi-skill activities. This week, a challenge course was set up and the children were put into groups to complete each challenge. First, we warmed up our bodies by doing some stretching. After that, we warmed up even more by doing lots of jumping, dancing, balancing and running on the spot. Then we moved onto the challenges! We had a hurdles station, a jumping from hoop-to-hoop station and finally, jumping from the floor onto a bench. Miss Leavey found this tricky, but the children did much better! We are now moving on to practicing for sports day. The children are all very excited.









YEAR 2

During our PE lessons over the last couple of weeks, we have been exploring different ways to warm up our bodies before physical activity. Warming up is important because it helps prepare our muscles, increases our heart rate, and reduces the risk of injury. One of our favourite warm-up activities is a game of Rock, Paper, Scissors — but with a fun twist! Instead of just playing the game standing still, we add movement. For example, players might have to hop, skip, or run to different spots after each round. This not only gets us thinking quickly but also gets our bodies moving and ready for more intense exercise.



YEAR 3

This week in PE, Year 3 began exploring their exciting new dance topic inspired by the solar system. The children were challenged to move like planets, stars, and other celestial bodies, using creative movement to represent the vastness of space. They thoroughly enjoyed sharing their performances with one another and are already looking forward to developing their routines further next week!



YEAR 4

This term, Year 4 are developing their tennis skills, focusing on hand-eye coordination, rallying, and controlled hitting. They are also impressing us with their gymnastics work, showing excellent balance and body control through a range of poses and sequences. Well done, Year 4!











During Summer term, we having been swimming during one of our PE lessons. Everyone has enjoyed these sessions and has improved their skills in the pool. We have had groups of children who could swim a whole length of the pool without stopping and some children now being able to swim a width unaided. We are all so proud of how the children have tackled the challenges with learning to swim!



YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 have been learning rounders. They have used great team work skills to work together to try and get the opposite team out.
