YEAR 6 UPCYCLING

Year 6 have been working on Upcycling in D.T this half term. We designed t-shirts and then had a D.T day to create them. We used a range of skills including drawing and cutting shapes, pinning pattern pieces to the t shirt, and tying a knot. We used a range of stitches such as running stitch and whipstitch and used sewing techniques such as Applique and Embroidery to add detail.













EARLY YEARS




YEAR 1

Year 1 had lots of fun this week programming animations and creating their own live scenes. They learnt how to input a shape, make it move and also add sounds too. They had so much fun creating their scenes! Aalayah created a brilliant Icelandic scene, where she input a penguin and polar bear. She made the polar bear walk towards the penguin and the penguin shouted 'help!'. Well done!



YEAR 2

This term, Year Two have been diving into the exciting world of Scratch! We've been learning how to change the background and characters (called sprites) to make our own fun scenes. We've also started using simple commands to make our characters move and interact. It's been a fantastic start to our coding journey, and we can't wait to create even more!





YEAR 3

This week in Computing we have been using Scratch to design algorithms. The children had to write sets of instructions to help move a sprite around a maze, which was both challenging and fun as they had to work out the exact number of steps their sprite needed to take and also which direction it needed to turn. They also learnt how to draw lines in Scratch using a pen extension which could move in all four directions!



YEAR 4

This term, Year 4 are developing their programming skills using Scratch. They're exploring concepts like loops, variables and conditional statements in a fun, hands-on way. The children are working brilliantly together to debug their code and share their projects with pride!



YEAR 5

In Computing this term we are consolidating our knowledge of the Scratch programme. Children have enjoyed experimenting with selection and conditions - which means planning actions based on whether certain statements are true or false. The children have used their sprites and added a forever loop, to show what happens when the statements have been met - there have been some weird and wonderful animations, complete with sounds, emanating from the laptops in class! We definitely have some budding IT specialists within the year group!





YEAR 6

This half term the children in Year 6 are using Scratch to design their own games. They have looked at how to change variables in games and how to input coding to increase or decrease a score.



CHATTERIS MIDSUMMER FESTIVAL

This weekend will be the Chatteris Midsummer Festival and Parade. Kingsfield are scheduled to take part and our chosen theme is 64 Zoo Lane. 
Congratulations to 3S this week who won the weekly attendance award with 99%. Enjoy your cake!




