The Year 6 prom last week was a fantastic celebration filled with fun and memories. A big thank you to Mrs. Henry for helping to make it all possible!



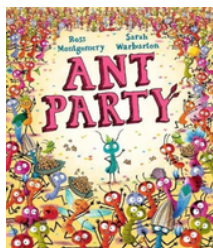
OPEN AFTERNOON

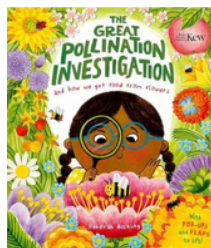
