

Further Information: Sports Premium 2024 2025

In-line with DFE guidance for reporting arrangements under 'Online Report' (https://www.gov.uk/guidance/pe-and-sport-premium-for-primary-schools) it states the published report must include:

- the amount of premium funding received
- a full breakdown of how it has been spent
- the impact seen by the school on pupils' participation and attainment in PE and sport
- how this improvement will be sustained?

The first three bullet points are covered by this year's uploads as part of the new online reporting tool. The last point is summarized below:

How will improvements be sustained?

We will continue to build upon the variety of activities available for girls and pupils who are disadvantaged. Some after school clubs will continue to be offered free of change for all pupils, with a % of spaces being allocated to pupils eligible for Pupil Premium. After school clubs will be run by sport specialists as well as teachers and support staff. Clubs have been run by sports coaches 4 days a week at lunchtime and after school. This has allowed for a large number of children to participate.

Our new PE Lead will use the CPD she has had this year to further enhance the PE provision at school, through monitoring and coaching of staff. ECTs will be able to access specific CPD, and CPD will be accessed to support teachers with skills and confidence for specific subjects. Some use of Sports coaches is aldo planned to work alongside all class teachers at some point in the year to help to develop sports specific skills. CPD this year will develop further links with other schools and the opportunities for competitive sport.

Our intention is to utilise the local swimming pool for booster sessions for pupils in Y6 to increase the % of Y6 pupils able to swim 25m confidently. Access

to the pool this year has been limited due to the closure of one pool and demand on the only local pool.

In 2025-26 we will be starting to develop Opal Play as a lunchtime provision – this will upskill staff and will create exciting opportunities for all children to engage in active play daily.
