As Historians we will:

Use historical language in our work.
Understand the timeline of the Anglo-Saxon period and when this falls within British History.
Describe historical events and ways of life and compare these to the modern day.
Learn about the role of the Anglo-Saxons in spreading Christian values across the world.
Understand how transport and crime & punishment have changed over time.
Understand how historical artefacts help us to understand how life was lived in Britain in the past.

As Citizens we will:

Learn about our rights and responsibilities including democracy and how we use it.
Discuss cultural differences and bullying.
Think about what it means if Christians believe God is holy and loving.

As readers we will:

Listen to and read stories linked to our units and answer questions about them.

As Mathematicians we will:

Recap place value of whole numbers up to 1,000,000, round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000, compare and order numbers to 1,000,000, understand negative numbers and learn about Roman Numerals.
Add numbers with and without exchanges, subtract numbers with and without exchanges. Use rounding to estimate and approximate, use inverse operations and solve multi-step addition and subtraction problems.
