We raised over £550 in profit for school funds to support all the children, and the classes are currently deciding what to spend it on. Although it was a whole Team Kirkbride effort, Miss Emily Satterthwaite, our apprentice Teaching assistant, was our chief organiser and did an amazing job of bringing it all together. We hope you had fun.

## **Christmas Trips**

We are delighted that we were able to send all our children on a fabulous Christmas Treat Trip. Thank you to our PTA for supporting us with this with a contribution from their funds, so we could offer this once again for every child.

Acorn class loved going to Whinlatter Forest on the Gruffalo Trail and brought back our hand-chosen Christmas Tree on the bus! Ash, Elm and Oak all ventured out to The Theatre by The Lake in Keswick to see The Jungle Book. Having performed Disney's version in school previously, it was a bit different and straight from the book by Rudyard Kipling, so the children were very surprised at the changes. The children talked about the visual and musical effects, and despite it being a long afternoon, they said they loved it.

## Breakfast and After School Club - Kirkbride Play and Stay Club

As you may remember from my previous newsletter, After School Club is now available from 3pm – 5.45pm. The additional 45 mins (5-5.45pm) is £3, which is a pro-rata cost. Mrs Heather Turnbull, one of our Mid-Day supervisors, is assisting at After School Club, with other staff on site available dependent on numbers and ages of children. The children have a full program of activities and are having a great time, eating, playing, making and sometimes just relaxing. Mrs Stamper continues to run Breakfast club 7.30am – 8.30am.

Remember you can book either of these options by 9pm the night before needed on School Hub. We don't ask you to book weeks in advance if you don't want to and we don't charge for cancellations. There will be a KPS club newsletter coming soon.

## **Lunches**

Over recent years, the cost of school dinners has increased dramatically through our providers Orian. We have been notified that the next price increase for 1st April 2025 and the cost of a school meal would be £3.66. The Governors and I feel that we would be able to supply a school dinner for our school that would be more cost-effective. Therefore, I wanted to let you know in advance and I will be seeking your thoughts in due course, we are in the process of moving our lunch offer 'in-house' and will be moving away from the catering providers Orian. As you will appreciate, this is a lot of work, and we want to get it right. The change will be on 1st April 2025, so there is time to complete this changeover, and get things sorted.

Mrs Neaves will continue to be our amazing School Cook, and we will work together to create a menu that reflects what we know our children enjoy, to support them in the school day. To do all of this, we will be looking at new systems for ordering lunches for parents, menu options and we will need to have all the costings, to ensure it is value for money.

Please rest assured, we will be making positive changes to ensure all children continue to have the offer of a nutritious, filling meal every day, and the ordering and payment for these will be considered very carefully. More information in a letter will be coming out to you soon, to get your views and thoughts on this change.

- Acorn class attended Multi-skills at Beacon Hill and had a great time working on lots of stations in the big hall, with some of the older students. They were very tired when they got back to school!
- Year 5 children completed their Cycle Wise training last week, with all passing the level. Their attitudes and behaviour were amazing, considering on Thursday the weather was not great in the build-up to Storm Eowyn. Thank you to Miss Satterthwaite for cycling with them and the instructor to ensure they were supported.
