

## 2019-2020 Pupil Premium Spending Plan

Date for review of this strategy: July 2020

Aims:

- Provide additional educational support to raise the achievement of our pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium.
- Narrow the gap between the educational achievement of these pupils and their peers.
- Address underlying inequalities, as far as possible, between these pupils and others. These often show in reduced concentration and less developed social skills

Specific focus:

- Close the attainment gap between Pupil Premium and Non Pupil Premium children.

Total Funding from Government for financial year 2019/2020= £13,426 (School Funded £700)

Total number of pupils in school - 83

Number of children eligible for pupil premium- 11 (13%)

Predicted total spend for this year: £14,126

The impact of the above programmes is monitored termly for individual pupils and the impact on progress for groups of pupils receiving pupil premium support.
