Continuing to build inclusive sport offers tailored to pupil interest and abilities. Use attendance data to identify pupils who are not yet engaging and target them. Expand competitive opportunities by collaborating with local schools and sports networks. Improve staff and pupil leader confidence and competence through strategic support and mentoring. Maintain SSCO to increase the schools capacity to offer a broad and engaging curriculum alongside an extensive Extra curricular enrichment program.	Use of pupil voice to develop the extracurricular program. Share this with all stakeholders and update it every half-term depending on interests and engagement. Set up easy to use attendance registers and monitor them every half term. Target pupils who do not attend and seek to fulfil their needs with new activity ideas. Enter all available local and regional competitions and support all pupils, including those with SEND and PP to represent their school. The SPIN partnership offers a wide range of festivals and competitions to take part in including Boccia, Table Cricket, Panathlon and SEND Football/Cross Country. Emphasize the entry into events which focus on inclusion and mass participation. Track through attendance registers and use them to monitor engagement and identify areas for further improvement. What impact/sustainability have you seen?	What evidence do you have?
Improved participation in extracurricular clubs and intra-inter school competitions across the school. Inter house football and sports day were a huge success. Year 6 girls and boys competed in the Huddersfield Football League and Cup events. We entered two girls and two boys teams into the Dymanos cricket competition and had one boys and one girls team qualify for the West Yorkshire and then the Yorkshire final; the boys just missed out on winning the event by 1 run. Both girls and boys cross country teams qualified for the West Yorkshire Final at Temple Newsome. The combined sport hall athletics team came third in the Kirklees area. We entered three teams in the SPIN netball tournament, ensuring 100% of those who had been to the club represented school in a competitive event. One team went on to win the Kirklees Final. KMS entered three rounders teams into the SPIN event and all had great success, with one winning the event overall. Improved access ensured for SEND and PP pupils, demonstrating equity in sport. We entered teams into the SEND Football competition, Boccia Panathlon, New Age Curling and we hosted the table cricket event. We provided sports leaders for this event and all had SEND. Competitive success achieved in local and regional events, contributing to enhanced school pride and pupil confidence.
