Use music and sound to help improve people's emotional well-being, relieve stress and build confidence.

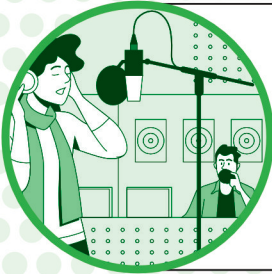

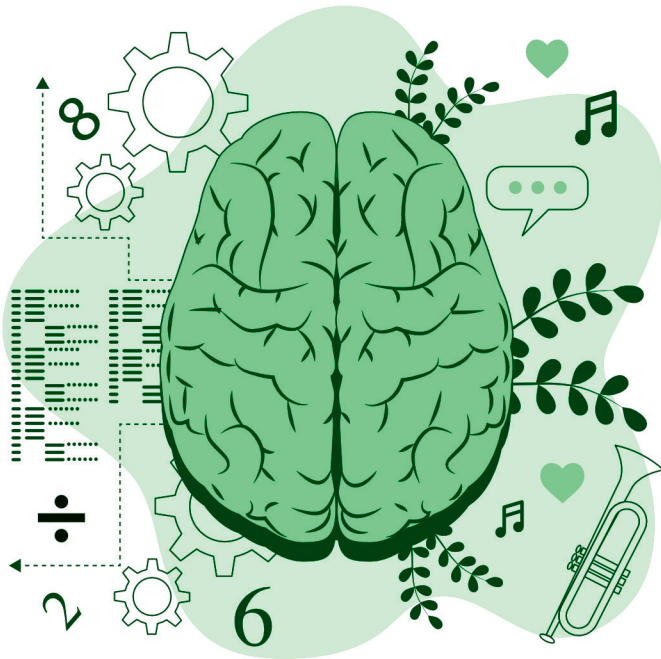
