As we near the end of another year here at KMS (I'm told summer is just around the corner?) I would like to provide you with one last school update as well as reminding you about the arrangements for the start of our new academic year in September.

Goodbye Year 8 and Hello Year 5

There are always mixed emotions at the end of the year when we say goodbye to one year group and welcome in another. Our Year 8 class leave KMS having achieved so much and each and every pupil should be very proud of their time in school. I would like to personally thank them for all they gave to the school and for being such superb role models to our younger year groups. Early reports from Shelley College suggest they have adapted very well to their new surroundings. As one year group leaves, another one joins and it has been an absolute pleasure to welcome our Year 6 class of 2024 into school this week. We recognise what a big step this is for pupils (and parents!) and everybody have been very impressed with the enthusiasm to learn and excellent levels of behaviour exhibited from our newest pupils. Well done everybody and keep it up!

Staff changes

This summer we say goodbye to several staff as they leave KMS for pastures new, including two members of staff who between them have accumulated over 50 years of service to the school! After 32 incredible years, Miss Kaye, a true KMS legend (and I don't use those words lightly), will be retiring at the end of term. During her many years in post, and with her infectious passion and enthusiasm for her subject, Miss Kaye has inspired a love of music in literally thousands of young people. She will very much be missed. We also say goodbye to Miss Abbas who, after 22 at KMS, leaves to work in a role supporting pupils with SEND. Miss Schofield, our extremely popular Head of Moxon house, is leaving to return to secondary education and Mr Stack is leaving to join an alternative provision school. We also say goodbye to Mrs Quinn, one of our ETAs who will be leaving to work in a SEND provision and to Miss Smith, our Pastoral Manager who leaves us to work in a secondary school to work as an assistant SENDCO. Finally, we wish Miss Dobson all the best as she starts her maternity leave. I'm sure everybody would like to join me in thanking all our departing colleagues for their wonderful work and wishing them all the very best for the future.

In September we will be delighted to welcome the following new colleagues to our school; Mr Williams – Deputy Headteacher, Mrs George – Teacher of Science, and Mrs Simmons – Teacher of Music. Mr Wiles will be joining the school from Scissett Middle School as teacher of PE, and maths; he will also be the new Head of Moxon house. Finally, Mrs Merrick will be moving in to the role of cover supervisor. I'm sure all members of our community will give them a very warm KMS welcome.

House System

Start of the Autumn Term

A reminder we will once again be running a staggered start to our autumn term as follows -

Monday 2nd September – Teacher training day Tuesday 3rd September – Year 6 pupils only Wednesday 4th September – Year 7 and 8 return.

We ask that pupils arrive on site no later than 8.50am each day so they can be sat in their seats ready for the start of the school day at 8.55am. Pupils who arrive after 8.55am will receive a late mark.

Buses

For pupils living in Shelley, we ask they get the closest bus to their house, either the KM1 or 411, in order to avoid overcrowding.

Uniform

We also hope to open our own uniform exchange service / school shop in the autumn term – any donations of good quality, clean uniform will be gratefully received.

Where there are persistent breaches of our uniform policy, pupils may be removed from mainstream lessons until they can comply with our expectations. We will check uniform as part of our daily form tutor programme and ask for your support in upholding our high expectations.

Equipment

Please ensure your child arrives properly equipped for school each day. This ensures lessons run smoothly and no learning time is lost for any child. Home – school relations

A reminder that we ask all interactions with the school are respectful, balanced and conducted in an appropriate manner. We all want the best for the pupils in our school and this is achieved by parents and staff working together. Parents are reminded that the following actions are deemed inappropriate and where these occur, staff have been instructed to end any dialogue:

- raised voices, threatening language or an aggressive tone during telephone conversations or in meetings
- unpleasant, aggressive or overly long emails
- parents who refuse to consider the school's point of view or respect school policies

We ask parents trust that when we make decisions we always aim to act in the best interests of all members of our school community. We fully support every parent's right to ask questions but we expect that this is done in a respectful and balanced way. We want to have good relationships with everyone connected to our school and we would hope that you feel the same way.

It has been another fantastic year at KMS and every single member of our school community has played their part in making our school such a special place to learn and work. Our pupils have continued to excel in all aspects of school life and we have had notable successes once again both inside and out of the classroom.
