### Headteacher Update

Welcome to our weekly parent bulletin, it seems the great British Summer may have finally arrived. Despite the weather, the week has felt very bright in school as we welcomed back our key worker pupils and some of our Year 6 cohort. I have no doubt there was a great deal of nervous anticipation over the weekend with the return to school looming, I know I certainly felt that way, however we are really pleased with the way the first week has gone. The pupils on sit have been an absolute credit to the school and their families showing levels of maturity well beyond their years. They settled extremely well into the routines of social distancing, regular hand washing and spending the day inside their 'bubbles'. This bodes extremely well as we look to open up our offer to more pupils from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. Well done everybody. Can I remind Year 6 parents that the deadline for completing the latest return to school survey is 4pm today. We have also had the first week of our revised provision for those pupils working off site. With fewer staff available to set and mark remote work, we are trialling new ways of ensuring all pupils receive the best possible curriculum experience when working from home. Despite only being one week in to the 'new' school term, we are already making plans for the new academic year in September. At this moment in time we don't know what this will look like. We hope it will be a return to school for all pupils however that is obviously entirely dependent on the decisions made by the government based on the latest scientific advice. A lot could change between now and then. As such we are starting to make plans for a number of different scenarios. Mrs Kerr and a group of colleagues across the Trust will meet next week to start planning for our 'recovery curriculum'. It is inevitable that pupils will have gaps in their learning following an extended period away from school and we need to ensure we have strategies in place in order to identify these early and plan a curriculum which enables pupils to catch up at an accelerated pace. This group will also focus on continuing to development approaches with remote learning in case September brings a mixed economy of pupils working for part of the week in school together with some time at home.

Further to the news on transition last week we have been busy making preparations for our outgoing Year 8 and our incoming Year 5. I attended a remote meeting with Mr Wadsworth (Shelley College Principal) and Mrs Large (Scissett Middle Head of School) where discussed all aspects of Year 8 transition so far and future plans. Year 8 parents will receive a joint letter today from the three schools which summarises the plans moving forward. We have also finalised our transition arrangements for our Year 6 class of 2020. Parents should receive a welcome pack in the post at some point next week which outlines our plans. Unfortunately, following recent government guidance, we can't have groups of pupils from other schools on our site at this moment in time. As such the planed tutor group assemblies for the end of term won't unfortunately be able to take place. We do however feel confident that our planned offer will help alleviate any potential concerns and ensure a smooth start in September- for both pupils and parents.

There are lots of great resources about transition <u>available here</u> on the BBC website which we highly recommended. Whilst they are tailored for the move to secondary school, most of the topics covered also apply to the move to both Middle School and High School.

The school social media feeds have once again provided a very eclectic mix of posts. This has included a new school logo design courtesy of Cameron, Mr Smith's very cryptic quiz, a wealth of careers information and we've

even been treated some baby photos of members of staff. The fund raising has continued this week; Amelie has run 5km in the wind and rain with her mum and sister. Finally Ruby has taken the very brave decision to shave her hair and raise money for a number of good causes. She will also be donating her hair to the Little Princess trust meaning her actions will help give a little girl 'the hair of her dreams'. Please click <u>here</u> for more information.
