Post Ofsted updates: We sent out a full list of the actions taken since our Inspection at the beginning of October. We continue to drive forward standards in school. The information relating to Careers is reported separately in the newsletter. Since the last update, we have also:

- Had our full action plan approved by Ofsted as appropriate in addressing the 'Next Steps'.
- Held a drop down morning for pupils about different issues relating to safety where they were excited to discuss and debate topics such as on line safety and healthy relationships.
- Had PC Baines, Safe Schools Officer, in to run workshops for pupils on 'county lines'. This is an issue which parents may have read about in the press. It relates to young people being drawn into 'gangs' to move drugs particularly in rural areas.
- Had 15 pupils apply to be Well Being Ambassadors. All have been accepted and we are excited to get the programme up and running in the new year.
- Welcomed two new colleagues to the Governing Body. Mrs Godman, who is a Trustee with an educational background and Mrs R Potter who is chair of Governors at Scissett Middle School

Absence reporting: Please can we remind parents to telephone school to report an absence if your child is unable to attend due to ill health. You must do this for each day of absence. We will contact home where children are not reported absent but are not in school to ensure they are safe and well. This can take a long time, so we would be grateful if parents could adhere to this process. New guidance stipulates that if we cannot contact a parent/carer, we may need to do a home visit or report to Police for a welfare check. This is for safeguarding reasons and follows a national case where children were left vulnerable due to a bereavement of a lone parent in the household. We are very grateful for parents support on this matter.

Eden's Forest, a social enterprise from Honley, who work to improve the mental and physical health of children, young people and adults, have offered to hold a clothing sale at school.
