#### **Word from the Head**

Welcome to our fortnightly parent bulletin, I hope you and your family are well. As we enter a second national lockdown, I would like to update you on some of the government guidance in relation to schools. The <u>updated guidance for schools can be found here</u> and the associated <u>guidance for parents can be found here</u>. The latest copy of our whole school Covid – 19 risk assessment together with other information can be found on our dedicated page on the <u>school website here</u>.

Attendance – School attendance remains mandatory for all. The only exception are those children whose doctors have confirmed they are still clinically extremely vulnerable and have advised them not to attend education whilst the national restrictions are in place. If you have any concerns about your child attending school due to a medical condition, please contact us immediately.

**Face coverings** – Are now mandatory for all schools in communal areas and on school buses. Each pupil **MUST** bring a mask to school day.

**Curricular and extra-curricular activities** - PE, sport, music, dance and drama lessons can continue in line with

the current guidance – during school time. After-school clubs can only continue if their primary purpose childcare;

this unfortunately means we won't be able to offer any after school clubs during the lockdown period.

**Remote learning** - Schools are expected to provide remote learning for any pupils who are self-isolating or clinically extremely vulnerable. This doesn't necessarily mean live lessons. Please see later item in this bulletin for more details about what this looks like at KMS.

**Bubbles** – Not related to the guidance however you may remember I wrote to you before half-term saying we may loosen some of our arrangements around bubbles, this certainly won't be happening for the foreseeable future.

We recognise this is a worrying time for all and we want to work with families to reassure them that we are doing everything we can to make it as safe as it can be for pupils to attend school. Pupils are very well versed in the new 'Covid secure' routines we have in place within school and we ask for your continued support in reinforcing the key messages of hands, face and space.

I wish you all the best over the coming fortnight and thank you for your ongoing support.

#### Flu Vaccine

Over the coming weeks, parents with pupils in Years 6 and 7 will be offered the opportunity to have their child vaccinated against flu.

Locala, who provide our community healthcare services, have asked we share the following information with parents. You may also find the <u>parent information leaflet here</u> of use.

There have been some concerns that have been raised regarding "shedding" of the virus from the vaccine and keeping children out of school for a certain period following the vaccination session in school.

"The nasal spray vaccine has a good safety record and unvaccinated contacts are not at risk of catching flu from the vaccine, either through being in the same room where flu vaccine has been given or by being in contact with a recently vaccinated individual".

In addition it outlines that "excluding children from school during the period when the vaccine is being offered, or in the following weeks, is not necessary. The only exception to this would be the tiny number of children who are extremely immunocompromised (for example those who have just had a bone marrow transplant)".

It remains parental choice as to whether they consent to their child having the vaccine, however we hope that the above information can help parents to have an informed choice.

# **Remote Learning**

As you will be aware, we have created a remote learning curriculum which mirrors our in school curriculum, so that we can ensure that all children who need to self-isolate, do not fall behind their peers. From next week we will also add the year group assembly for children to watch and the daily notices that we read out to form groups. In addition we would ask that your child completes a remote learning survey at the end of their isolation period/time off school to help us monitor engagement and our processes. Whilst the government message remains very clear that they intend to keep schools open, we are conscious that things could change in the future and as such we continue to make contingency plans should the government decide to close schools to certain year groups or if we need to isolate whole bubbles or year groups. All of our pupils now have microsoft email addresses which will give us more secure options when contacting pupils and families. Microsoft Teams will also provide us with a secure platform to help us offer a mixture of 'live' and/or recorded lessons in the event of closure. There is considerable work going on behind the scenes to train both staff and pupils and we will keep you informed of our plans via the school bulletin.

## Musica

Musica are back!

We welcomed back our fabulous team of specialist teaching staff from Musica this week to Kirkburton Middle school, covering all instruments; piano and keyboard, Brass, Woodwind, Upper and Lower Orchestral Strings, Electric and Classical Guitar, Drums and Voice. Over 50 of our pupils have enjoyed 'reconnecting' with their specialist teachers and it has been great to see our pupils attending their lessons again and hearing them play.



#### **Careers**
