Plant a tree for the Jubilee



The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Everyone across the UK is being invited to plant trees from October 2021, when the tree planting season begins, through to the end of the Jubilee year in 2022.

The <u>Queen's Green Canopy</u> will create a network of individual trees, avenues, copses and whole woodlands in honour of The Queen's service and the legacy she has built.

Here at KMS we'd like to not only support the Queen's Green Canopy scheme but we will also be trying to raise funds to purchase three mature trees. These three trees would be planted on the edge of the field to provide some shade for the children when they are playing outside in the summer. Why three trees I hear you ask, one for each of the year groups at KMS to nurture and as a legacy for the Y8s to pass on to future generations. Three because we know they will be expensive, saplings are prone to damage by the weather and vandalism, whereas a more substantial tree will not be so easily broken and bent in the elements.

We hope you will help us with this project and donate as much as you can spare to help us achieve this goal.
