### Covid-19 Vaccine

As you are aware, 'the UK's chief medical officers have recommended a single vaccine dose for 12 to 15-year-olds - who are deemed at very low risk from the disease - saying factors such as disruption to education tipped the balance.'

We have been chosen as the first school in Kirklees to receive the vaccine and all year 8 parents should receive a letter and consent form today with further details. We ask all consent forms are returned on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> September.

The local authority has taken the decision to only offer the vaccine in schools to year 8 and above. They will shortly be publicising how those pupils who are in year 7 and have turned 12 can access the vaccine. As soon as we have this information we will share it with you.

## **School Uniform**

### **School Buses**

We remind parents that the government guidance for school buses states 'The government has removed the requirement to wear face coverings in law but expects and recommends that they are worn in enclosed and crowded spaces where you may come into contact with people you don't normally meet. This includes public transport and dedicated transport to school or college.' We thank you for your support with this.

## **School Catering**

Parents are reminded that our school meals are now provided by Academy Catering. We have always been extremely happy with the quality of the meals served in school however academy are looking to take this to the next level. They pride themselves on ensuring meals are cooked from scratch using the freshest ingredients. To date we have been extremely impressed with the service. ### Please note-

- From Monday we will be offering a break time service. Some of you may remember this as the Burton Bistro. Each year group will be allocated a day when they can attend the Bistro.
- Pupil must have credit on their ParentPay account to purchase food at break time.
- Pupils in receipt of free school meals will only be able to purchase food at break time if they have additional credit on their ParentPay account.
- To qualify for the meal deal, pupils must chose still water only as their drink option.
- You can view your child's meal choices through ParentPay.
- We do not serve hot drinks in school.

## GL Assessments - Year 6

From Friday 17<sup>th</sup> September we will be conducting GL progress tests in English and Mathematics. These will take place in Maths and English Lessons and there will be no disruption to the timetable. Each test is standardised against national benchmarks and the tests will provide key information to support your child's progress in preparation for the academic year including:

- To show where your child is at now and identify any additional support;
- To identify gaps in knowledge;
- To allow adjustments to learning, teaching, assessment and planning
- To indicate potential performance in Key Stage 2
   Assessments

Your son/daughter will not be required to revise or study for the GL tests.

## Science

We are looking forward to the year ahead in the Science department at Kirkburton Middle School. This year our homework is going to consist of two parts: keywords and online quizzes. The quizzes will be set on SENECA learning, this is a website that is free for all students to use and contains short, self-assessed quizzes that will be set by your child's science teacher.

The first science homework for this year is going to be for our students to sign up to SENECA, here are some instructions for getting signed up:

- 1. Type this website into your search engine: <a href="https://app.senecalearning.com/sign-up">https://app.senecalearning.com/sign-up</a>
- 2. Follow the instructions to sign up using first name and surname.
- 3. It will ask for a parent email address to allow account recovery.
- 4. In lessons teachers will share a class code that students can enter individually to access their homework.
