## **Contact tracing**

A reminder that schools are still responsible for contact tracing over the coming days as follows:

- You should continue to contact us if your child develops Covid 19 symptoms on or before Sunday 20th December and subsequently tests positive for coronavirus. The contact address is: covid@kirkburtonmiddleschool.co.uk
- School leaders will check emails once per day up until Thursday 24th December. After this date, you do not need to notify us unless your child will not be back in January – in which case you should report absence in the normal way.
- Should school receive a report of a positive result on or before Thursday 24th December, we will continue to contact trace so may advise families of the need to self-isolate should your child be a close contact.

We really hope there will be no need to contact families before Christmas.

Apps to try on new phones or Tablets over the Christmas period:

Sumaze! Is a series of educational puzzle apps developed by Mathematics Education Innovation. (MEI) There are four versions for pupils to try: Sumaze! Primary – for those pupils who struggle and to

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Sumaze! 2 – a challenge for pupils in years 6, 7 & 8 Sumaze! – the original aimed at pupils 14+ - a challenge for year 8 pupils.

Sumaze! Adventure – new this year – again a challenge for all in years 6, 7 & 8.

Last year's 2019 Royal Institution Christmas lectures are still available, and heavily maths-flavoured. Presented by mathematician Hannah Fry, the three lectures cover luck, algorithms and the limits of maths, in an accessible and entertaining way. Perfect for Key Stages 2 upwards. ## Shakuntala Devi (PG)

The extraordinary story of Shakuntala Devi, the world-renowned mathematician who lived her life on her own terms. While the film pays tribute to her genius as a mathematician, it also humanizes her as a woman and mother, in trying to capture her indomitable spirit. Told through the lens of her relationship with her daughter Anu, the film highlights their very different struggles and aspirations.

## **Hidden Figures (PG)**

As the United States raced against Russia to put a man in space, NASA found untapped talent in a group of African-American female mathematicians that served as the brains behind one of the greatest operations in U.S. history. Based on the unbelievably true-life stories of three of these women, known as "human computers", we follow these women as they quickly rose the ranks of NASA alongside many of history's greatest minds specifically tasked with calculating the momentous launch

of astronaut John Glenn into orbit, and guaranteeing his safe return.

## The Imitation Game (12A)

Based on the real life story of legendary cryptanalyst Alan Turing, the film portrays the nail-biting race against time by Turing and his brilliant team of code-breakers at Britain's top-secret Government Code and Cypher School at Bletchley Park, during the darkest days of World War II.
