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Word from the Head

Welcome to our fortnightly parent bulletin, I hope you and your family are well. We've had an extremely busy fortnight in school once again.

As you are aware, the school was inspected by OFSTED on Tuesday and Wednesday this week. In a series of special assemblies on Monday we asked pupils to do one very important thing for us during the inspection – 'do what you normally do every day'. I'm pleased to say they followed this instruction to the letter and they were an absolute credit to themselves, the school and you as parents. Thank you to everybody who completed the Parent View survey which was extremely positive. We remind parents to always contact school if ever they have any questions or concerns in order that we can try and address these promptly. At this stage we are not allowed to share the judgements made by the inspection team publicly but we are pleased with how the inspection went. The final report should be published within 30 working days of the inspection and we will email this to all parents as soon as we receive it.

Last Wednesday Mrs Greenough (Mast Trust CEO), Mrs Large (Headteacher, Scissett Middle) and Mrs Knowles (Headteacher, Shelley First) spent the day in school evaluating our RE and French curriculums. They also looked at behaviour in school and our provision for those pupils with SEND. All visitors were very complimentary

about how polite and well-mannered our pupils are. They were also very impressed with the other aspects of the school they observed. Mr Taylor will spend a day at Scissett Middle and a day at Shelley First undertaking a reciprocal review.

On Thursday last week the school came together for our annual act of remembrance. Pupils spent the first part of the lesson in tutor groups learning about Armistice day and then everybody assembled outside. We listened to two pieces of poetry which were read beautifully by Josie and Ethan and then the school fell silent for the Last Post and a 2 minute period of silent reflection. Following the silence, wreaths were laid at the front of the school. The behaviour and respect shown by every single pupil was exemplary and I wish parents were present to see how fantastic their children were. A very moving experience for all who were present. Many thanks also to Arooj, James, Charlotte and Tom who represented the school at the community act of remembrance in Kirkburton. A wreath was laid on behalf of pupils and staff at our school. Miss Kaye played the Last Post and Reveille. On display were some memorial stones which pupils at our school have designed – they are most impressive and well worth a look.

The past two weeks has also brought a number of sporting fixtures, odd socks day for mental health week, our non-uniform day organised by the school council to raise money for Children in Need and much more.

It's hard to believe we are nearly halfway through this second half-term already. Thank you as always for your ongoing support and I hope you have a good weekend.

We will continue enjoying, achieving, succeeding together.
