Word from the Head

I hope you and your family are well in these ever changing times. As you are aware, for the first time, we had to ask members of our school community to self-isolate following news of a positive Covid-19 case in school. I'm pleased to report the person in question has only experienced minor symptoms and will be ready to attend school at the end of their isolation period. Sending pupils home from school is the last thing a Headteacher wants to do at any time. I am therefore very grateful for the support and understanding shown by the parents of those children who have been asked to self-isolate.

We are becoming increasingly concerned with the number of pupils who are congregating at the skate park in the mornings before school, some as early as 8am, and then arriving late to school or missing their staggered start time. This practice undoes a lot of the hard work staff undertake in school in terms of maintaining bubbles. Please contact your child's form tutor if our staggered start times are causing your family genuine difficulties.

Finally it has been great to receive so much positive feedback about the resumption of our traditional school lunch menu. I've made sure these have been shared with our kitchen team and they've asked me to pass on their thanks.

Face Coverings

Thank you for your support with sending your child to school with a face covering and a sealable plastic bag to store it in. We do have a small minority of pupils who are regularly arriving to school without a face covering. We have been loaning and laundering reusable face coverings however our supplies are now running low. If your child has borrowed a black or white school face covering we'd ask they return it to school on Monday. If we run out of face coverings we will have to supply disposable face coverings at a cost to parents.

Traffic around school

Thank you for your continued support in keeping the school perimeter a traffic free zone. A reminder that there are lots of places where you can drop your child off away from the school site which makes the start and end of the school day safe for everybody. The walk will do them good.

Library books

Our library shelves are looking a little bare at the moment. There are lots of books which haven't been returned following the school closure. Please could you have a good look at home for school library books and return them ASAP. If you have friends or neighbours with children in Year 9 at Shelley, please could you pass on this message.

These pupils can either return the books to us or to the library at Shelley from where we will collect them.

Building works

Roofing

I'm pleased to report that our roofing contractors are making good progress. There has been some noise generated by this work however disruption has been kept down to minimum. We hope the works will be completed early in the spring term.

Perimeter fence

The school has secured funding from the department of education in order to erect a perimeter fence around the full site. This is a decision we have not taken lightly however, following very careful consideration, we feel it is necessary in order to ensure all our pupils are properly safeguarded whilst they are in the care of the school. Please note, this action should not be seen as the school shutting the community out. As Headteacher, I firmly believe schools should sit at the centre of the communities they serve. As such we will continue to work closely with the local football club and other community organisations in order to ensure our grounds can be used in the evenings and weekends in a controlled and safe manner.

Contacting school

Please see page five of the pupil planner for full details about contacting school. In most cases, your first point of contact should be your child's form tutor. We will always aim to provide a response within 48 hours.

First Day Absence - we ask that parents or carers telephone or email the school office (before 10:00am) on the rare occasion a student is absent and explain why the student is not at school. The school should be contacted every day thereafter until the student returns. From 10:00am onwards the school will contact home to seek an explanation for any unexplained absence.

Appointments during the School Day – please email the School Office or write in a note in your child's planner and we ask if pupils **do not** bring their phones into school on these occasions where possible. Thank you for your support.

Covid – 19 update

We ask pupils and their families for their ongoing support in doing everything they possible can to keep any infection out of school. We will continue to work in line with our approved risk assessment in order to keep 'contacts' between pupils and staff to an absolute minimum. Please could parents continued to reinforce the following with their children -

- Maintain high levels of hand hygiene and avoid touching their face.
- Tell an adult if they feel unwell.
- Following social distancing rules where possible.
- Keep their hands to themselves particularly at social times.
- Face coverings must be worn at all times on the buses.
- We recommend all pupils wear face coverings when moving around the school building.
- Follow 'catch-it, bin-it, kill-it.'
- Remember 'Hands, Face, Space.'
