School improvement visit

This week we welcomed Mr McGrath into school. Mr McGrath joined us in his role as a school improvement consultant however he is also a part of Her Majesty's Inspection team at OFSTED. Mr McGrath spent two days in school evaluating the recent work of leaders and he also provided lots of extremely useful feedback and training.

OFSTED Update

We have received the draft copy of the inspection report from our OFSTED visit before Easter. This will now be finalised following our feedback and should therefore be ready for publication very shortly. As soon as we get the final copy we will share it with yourselves. This term we will get another visit from OFSTED as part of their ongoing monitoring of the school however this time, inspectors will come on site. We very much look forward to showing them the progress we have made since the October 2019 inspection.

Please can we remind parents that school starts at 8.55am, this is the latest time we expect pupils to be arriving at their classroom door not entering the school grounds. This is the first time that we have been able to offer any musical extra-curricular clubs this academic year. It was great to see the pupils enjoying making music together even in a socially distanced, Covid safe setting and in the Music room too! It was attended by 10 Year 6 pupils and led by Miss Roulson and Miss Kaye.









Accelerated Reader

We are really pleased with pupils' attitudes to reading in form time and all year 6 and 7 pupils should be confident in logging into their Accelerated Reader account. We'd like to encourage pupils to quiz at home as accessing computers and laptops in school is more challenging under Covid regulations. We'd like pupils to quiz as soon as they finish their book. Pupils can also quiz on books they read at home if they are available on Accelerated Reader.

It would also help us if pupils could choose their next book from the library online in order to reduce numbers in the library. Instructions on how to do this are attached to this bulletin.

Questions to ask your child about the book they are reading.

Talking to your students about the books they read is one of the best ways to support their literacy development. Your students' needs to engage in critical thinking to discuss a book — a key skill for success in school as well as life. Here are some tips on how to start and sustain a book discussion with your students:

Before your child reads a book, ask:

- Why did you select this book?
- What makes you think this book is going to be interesting?
- What do you think the book is going to be about?
- Does this book remind you of anything else you've already read or seen?
- What kind of characters do you think will be in the book?
- What do you think is going to happen?

While your child is reading a book, try asking:

- Will you catch me up on the story? What's happened so far?
 - What do you think will happen next?
 - If you were that character, what would you have done differently in that situation?
 - If the book was a TV show, which actors would you cast in it?
 - Where is the book set?
- If the main character in that story lived next door, would you be friends?
- What does the place look like in your head as you read? Would you want to visit there?
- Did you learn any new words or facts so far?

After your child has finished a book, ask questions like:

- What was your favourite part of the book? Why?
- Who was your favourite character? Why?
- What was the most interesting thing you learned from the book?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
 - Would you have ended the book differently? Did it end the way you thought it would?
- Did the problem of the book's plot get solved?
- If you could change one thing in the book, what would it be?

You are able to have 3 books at a time.






Press 'Reserve' and then 'Reserve at School'
