

Maths SAT Update

Times Tables

Congratulations to pupils in 6F who won the first TTRockstars battle. A new battle will begin next week.

Times table knowledge is key to being confident in Mathematics as many topics rely on this knowledge. We are not asking pupils to be the quickest at the times tables but rather to accurate with answers. The expectation is that pupils should be able to answers any times tables up to 12 x 12 accurately within 6 seconds. This is something you can practice in the car, around the table or anywhere where you are able to give your child quick questions to complete verbally.

SAT practice

To help pupils with their confidence in May, we have one final SAT practice to complete. This will cover a previous paper in exam conditions so that pupils know what will be expected of them. We will also send home a paper to practice at home. This should also be completed in exam conditions to the correct timings for the paper.

Uniform

Whilst the vast majority of children turn up to school on time and in the correct uniform every day, in recent weeks we have noticed an increase in pupils wearing trainers. Please can you support the school, by ensuring your child comes to school wearing the correct uniform. **If there is a** genuine reason why your child is not in the correct uniform, please put a comment in their planner

for their form tutor. The comment should give the reason and when you expect for it to be



rectified. Please contact your child's form tutor if you wish to discuss this further.

From Monday 14th March any child who is not wearing the correct footwear to school will risk further sanctions, unless there is note in their planner. Thank you for your support.

The lost property mountain is getting bigger!




