MR PARKER HEAD OF YEAR 6

- The HOY is responsible for the pastoral well-being of all the Year 6 pupils.
- I have a team of 6 form tutors who work with the pupils on a daily basis.
- Our job is to make sure your child is safe, cared for and feels valued in the school community.



OUR TWO COMMUNITY RULES IN YEAR 6:

These two rules allow us to have a secure, welcoming and caring community in Year 6.

THE FIRST DAY: TUESDAY 7TH SEPTEMBER (MONDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER IS A TRAINING DAY)

- Please aim to have your child on the school site by 8.45am. If they are using the school bus service this will get them here at around this time.
- If you can arrange for your child to arrive at the front entrance of school this is very helpful.
- I will be there to greet them and to help organise them into their form groups along with their form tutors.
- Please try to ensure your child knows the name of their form group and the name of their form tutor.

THE FIRST DAY: TUESDAY 7TH SEPTEMBER (MONDAY 6TH SEPTEMBER IS A TRAINING DAY)

- They will have an assembly in the morning with Mr Taylor/myself.
- A tour of the school with their form tutor.
- Time with their new form group in the morning to sort out their school planner and other admin.
- Then start to attend lessons later in the day.
- School finishes at 3.35pm. I will be there to see the pupils off-site from the main entrance.
 OUR INTENTION IS THAT ONLY YEAR 6 WILL ATTEND ON TUESDAY 7TH SEPT (THIS BECOMES THEIR TRANSITION DAY)

TUTOR GROUPS

We have worked very closely with feeder First Schools when putting together our new tutor groups. The philosophy is that they have some friends/classmates from their previous school but then a mixture of pupils from other feeder schools.

THE SCHOOL DAY

- We are currently finalising our new school day as this year we have had to run a different day due to COVID restrictions.
- Usually 3 lessons in the morning which is split by a break.
- Lunchtime
- 2 lessons in the afternoon before dismissal.

SCHOOL EQUIPMENT: WHAT DO PUPILS NEED?

- A pencil case
- A Black & Green ink pen (cartridge, fibre tip or roller ball)

- A pair of compasses
- A calculator
- A small pair of scissors
- You are not allowed to use Tippex
- A schoolbag a back pack is an ideal size.
 Water bottle (labelled with your name)
- A purse or wallet in which to keep your money

CONTACTING SCHOOL

Your first point of contact should usually be with your child's **form tutor** as they will get to know your child on a daily basis. If your query is subject specific, then contact your child's **subject teacher** in the first instance.

If you wish to email a member of staff directly you will need to know their first initial and the correct spelling of their surname. A full staff list can be found on the school website.

CONTACTING SCHOOL

ATTENDANCE

Please be aware of the following information:

- Holidays during term time are not permitted. Please see Shelley Pyramid attendance policy here.
- The school day starts at 8:55am.
- Pupils are expected to attend school on time every day.
- All absences must be authorised by parents/carers, so please notify us of absences daily on 01484 222737
- Clear procedures in place for when we don't hear from parents (pg 13 of transition booklet)

SCHOOL LUNCHES

- We run a cashless lunch system
- Rota system by year group
- Choice of lunches
- You can monitor your child's meal choices via ParentPay
- Please set up a payment alert on ParentPay
- Dietary requirements we will contact you to draw up a 'menu plan'



SCHOOL BUSES

- Pupils arriving by school bus will be dropped off in the school turning circle and at the end of the day pupils catching a school bus will be supervised to line up ready in the turning circle.
- Pupils will be given a specific seat on the bus and will be expected to remain there on their journey.
- Misbehaviour on the school buses endangers pupils, the driver and other passengers. Such behaviour brings the school into disrepute. IT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
- Bus monitors, the driver and the bus company will inform the school of any misbehaviour.
- If reported, pupils will be temporarily or permanently excluded from the school buses. Parents/carers will be informed and will be responsible for arranging alternative transport.
