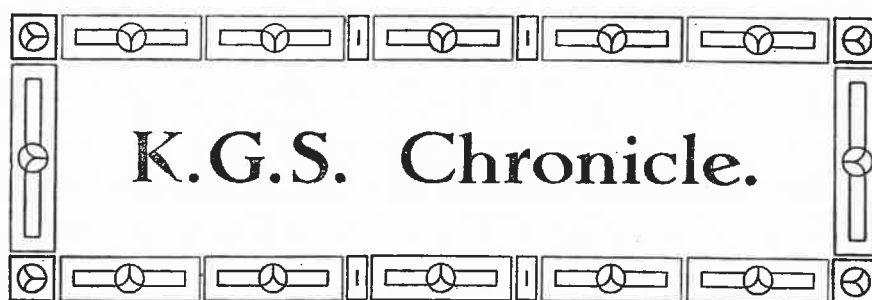

## Swimming, 1939.

The season must be considered a very satisfactory one, for 205 boys were able to swim and this represents 85% of the total strength of the School. New certificates were won by 17 boys for the mile, 46 for six lengths and 38 for one length. A swimming match was held against Blackpool Grammar School whom we have never yet beaten. We lost this by a narrow margin after being in the lead just before the last event. A pleasing feature of this match was our success in the Junior Squadron Race, promising well for the future.

The competition for the House Cup produced another close struggle between the School House and the Kirkham House. This year the Kirkham House won the Cup from the School House, who beat them last year by the narrow margin of one point. The entries for the sports were larger than ever before, and the fast times recorded testify to the excellence of the swimming.

## Prize Day, 1939.

Prize Day was held on July 29th. The prizes were presented by Lieut. General Sir James O'Dowda. The Rev. R. W. M. Holme, M.A., Chairman of the Governors presided. He expressed on behalf of the Governors their satisfaction that they had been enabled to complete the fine extensions to their buildings, and announced the purchase of 5½ acres of land adjoining the playing fields for the purpose of extending the school playing space.

The Headmaster in presenting his 20th annual report expressed a welcome for the introduction of compulsory military service. "I welcome this form of conscription from which all the stigma of the conscript has been removed. It supplies what has been lacking in our educational system, discipline and manly training at a time when too often the influence of school has worn rather thin. Any voluntary system is unfair for willingness to volunteer is not always met by equality of opportunity. We educate boys up to 16 or 17 or 18, and see them enter some useful occupation, but they need something more to make them men and this six months of military service will put the seal on our work both physically and morally."

In addressing the boys General O'Dowda said "The main object of education is to give you such instruction as will enable you to think for yourself and develop your character so that you may gain that self reliance which is so essential in after life. Never has it been more vital than it is to-day when the whole world is in a state of chaos and confusion that you should realise your responsibilities as citizens of the Empire, the greatest the world has ever known.

I think that each one of you should do your utmost to maintain that heritage. Be ready to give your service to your country and to others. In whatever walk of life you go, do not let self overshadow that service."

## Annual Meeting. Dinner. Dance.

Soon after the outbreak of war the Committee met and carefully investigated the possibility of holding the Annual Dinner which had been provisionally fixed for November 25th. They regretfully came to the conclusion that it was not possible to hold the dinner or any other social function during the war.

In coming to this decision the Committee were influenced not only by problems of black-out, rationing and transport, but still more by the consideration that a very large proportion

of members would be away on active service, and any such gathering would be unrepresentative. For the same reasons it was felt to be impossible to hold a representative annual meeting and that the best course would be for the Officials and Committee to remain in office until it should be possible after the war to hold such a meeting.

The Committee wish to emphasize the importance of keeping up the membership of the Association during these difficult times.

All members were duly notified to this effect.

The Rugby Match—Past v. Present was played on November 25th, under appalling weather conditions and resulted in a victory for the Present School by 32 points to 3.

## Prize Day at K.G.S. 50 years ago

*(from the Local Press, 1/9/1890).*

The annual distribution of prizes to the pupils attending the Kirkham Grammar School took place yesterday afternoon. After a short service in the Parish Church, an adjournment was made to the school, where, in the absence of Canon Mason, Mr. E. Garlick, J.P., occupied the chair. The other governors present were Messrs. Thomas Fair, J.P., Lytham; S. Stott, J.P., J. Ward, J. A. Nicholson, and W. G. Wray, whilst there were also present Mr. W. J. Dickson, Secretary to the governors; the Rev. W. S. Matthews, B.A., headmaster, and Messrs. C. R. Selfe and R. Charlton, assistant-masters. — Mr. DICKSON, after a few appropriate remarks from the Chairman, read the report of the examiner, the Rev. G. T. Tatham, vicar of Leck, and formerly headmaster of Preston Grammar School. The examiner, in his report, said that in the school there were, of course, some weak as well as strong points, and his object would be to speak of both, in the hope that in the future the strong points might be made stronger, and the weaker ones strengthened. The report continued, "The education given in the school is good—so good that I cannot understand why more parents do not take advantage of it, especially men of not very large means who desired high and liberal education for their sons. If the numbers of it increased considerably the education could be greatly improved, the weak points would vanish, the numbers in the higher forms could be increased, and consequently competition in the school would be fostered,

THE CHAIRMAN then announced that the scholarship of Wm. Harrison's charity had been gained by Thomas A. Singleton in that school. Foundation scholarships, value £6 each, had been won by W. T. S. Mr. NICHOLSON seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously. The headmaster having responded, the proceedings terminated with a vote of thanks to the chairman.
