Dear Old Boys of K.G.S.,

Let me impress upon you at the outset my earnest desire to do everything possible to maintain and foster the ties of affection and loyalty which I know to exist between you and the School. A new Headmaster finds that he quickly adds considerably to the number of his acquaintances, of whom Old Boys form a large proportion; I hope that before many years are over acquaintances will have become friends.

Changes there are bound to be. However healthy and successful a school may be, change is often a valuable tonic, provided that it is not just a question of change for change's sake, and that the best of the traditions of the past are duly preserved. It was with some trepidation that Speech Day was altered with regard to both date and place. The general approval of the Old Boys present, and of many who sent their apologies for absence, has been most encouraging. I hope the idea of an Old Boys' Reunion for cricket and social activity at the end of the Summer term will be equally acceptable.

It is quite possible, too, that the present School year will see the birth of a School Magazine, thus enabling the K.G.S. Chronicle to be devoted entirely to Old Boys' news and affairs. The production of the Chronicle will be under the aegis of the Old Boys' Committee, who might bring it out as a supplement to the School Magazine, with which it would be bound up, or as an entirely separate publication.

The School, past and present, will soon have to consider what form of War Memorial it is to have; it will also be necessary to formulate plans for the celebration of the 400th Anniversary of its foundation (1949). Recent educational developments seem to indicate that the endowment of University Scholarships will be superfluous. It would appear that the best

form of memorial would be to add to the material amenities of the School. Future generations of K.G.S. boys who would enjoy them would then for ever be reminded of their debt to their forerunners.

It will be noticed that a large amount of space has been devoted in this issue to the names and addresses of present members of the Old Boys' Association. It is vital to the success of future activities that this list is brought completely up to date. It is equally vital that the Roll of Honour shall be complete and accurate. Your help will be valued in both these respects.

In the meantime the very best wishes of Mrs. Norwood and myself go out to you all. We look forward to many years of happy relationship between us here on the spot and the Old Boys of the School wherever you may happen to be.

## Old Boys' News.

THE 20TH GENERAL MEETING.

The 20th General Meeting, the first since 1938, was held at the School on July 21st, 1946, after the cricket match Old Boys v. School. Mr. Denis Norwood, M.A., was in the chair, and after introducing himself as our new President, read to the meeting the following letter from Mr. J. H. Rigby:

July 19th, 1946.

"The President, K.G.S. Old Boys' Association, Dear Sir.

"Cricket Match and Meeting on Saturday. I found your two letters relative to these on my return from a fortnight's holiday. As I cannot attend either event, a few particulars may help any discussion of future Association plans. membership is around 500 (300 or so being Life Members) exact figures as yet uncertain owing to war casualties and changes. Financial position: pending preparation of a balance sheet covering the war years, I should say the Midland Bank balance will approach £255 after postages, etc., are deducted. In the Halifax Building Society account there is £119 19s. 6d., which arises from a lady client's legacy of £100 handed to us by her solicitor, the late Mr. Cockshott of Southport, then the oldest "Old Boy.' To-day this rather doubtful honour of being the 'oldest Old Boy' appears to be mine—I was at K.G.S. from 1874 to 1880. Needless to say, I would much rather have been one of the youngest Old Boys. However, I find considerable consolation in feeling privileged to emulate Mr. Cockshott's example and to ask the Association's acceptance of £100 whenever another secretary is found to take my This secretary should be forty years younger than I, brimful of enthusiasm over his work, and—above all—with plenty of time to devote to it; I have never had this latter essential in all the 26 years since the Association's formation.

"My regards to you and any Old Boys at the meeting.

Everyone at the meeting felt that the Old Boys were losing a Secretary and Treasurer who had given signal service and a great amount of time and energy to the Association, and it was with sincere regret that Mr. Rigby's resignation was accepted. Following discussion, Mr. H. C. Turner was elected Hon. Secretary, and it was agreed that the appointment of Hon. Treasurer should be considered in committee.

An interim Committee was then elected, and the following were appointed, with the President and Hon. Secretary: Messrs. A. Aiken, J. Threlfall, F. Jolly, J. Tomlinson, F. A. Mullineau, E. A. Spencer, R. O. Wilson, E. Edwards, H. Calland, B. Dodson.

Future activities of the Association were discussed, and the following suggestions were offered for the consideration of the Committee:

- 1.—The Annual Dinner should be held in the Easter Term, 1947, preceded by the Annual General Meeting.
- 2.—The Old Boys' Dance should be held in the School on Friday, January 10th, 1947. Tickets can be obtained from the Hon. Secretary.
- 3.—Old Boys' Matches should be played on Saturdays.
- 4.—The General Register should be brought up to date.
- 5.—The qualification for Life Membership should be revised.
- 6.—A Cricket Week-end and/or Old Boys' Week should be held towards the end of Summer Term.
- 7.—A calendar, listing the dates of Association events, should be sent to each member.
- 8.—The School Calendar, amalgamating Association events, should be sent to each member.
- 9.—An informal Dance should be held at the St. John's Ambulance Hall, Kirkham, after the rugby match, Old Boys v. School, to be played on Saturday, December 7th, 1946.

A hearty vote of thanks was accorded to Mr. Rigby for his fine work as Hon. Secretary and Treasurer, undertaken from the inception of the Association until 1946, and Mr. Turner was asked to convey to Mr. Rigby the warmest thanks of all present at the meeting.

The meeting then closed.

Since the above date the Committee have met, and three Sub-committees formed to organise—

- (a) Games: Cricket, Football, Golf. Hon. Secretary, Mr. R. O. Wilson.
- (b) Social events: Dinner, Dance, etc. Hon. Secretary, Mr. C. A. Spencer.
- (c) Publishing of the Chronicle and publicity. Hon. Secretary, Mr. E. Edwards.
- Mr. H. C. Turner was elected Hon. Treasurer of the Association.

The Old Boys' Dance will be held at the School on Friday, January 10th, 1947, and it is hoped to hold the Annual Dinner on either March 5th or 8th, 1947.

Tickets for the Dance will be available during December, and can be had from Mr. Spencer or any member of the Committee. The number of tickets will be limited.

This is my last report and I cannot help looking back. I have known K.G.S. for 39 years, and for 31 of these years I have served your School... Mention is made elsewhere in this Chronicle of the activities of the Army Cadet Force, but the great service to the Unit and to the School of Capt. G. Hughes, M.C., as Commanding Officer, and to his other Officers, Messrs. E. J. Williams and B. Stevenson, must here be placed on record at the time of their retirement from School Cadet affairs after the very arduous and difficult war years.

## Cricket, 1945 and 1946.

These have been two disappointing seasons, the performances having been well below that which we have come to expect from the representatives of K.G.S. In 1945, players who had previously excelled were almost monotonously below form, although a fairly good standard of fielding was maintained, and some good bowling came from W. B. Cartmell, G. Chatburn and I. In 1946, whether due to the absence of the mower and the consequent roughness of the outfield or not, the general standard of fielding was low. S. H. Edwards, who had shown promise in the 2nd Eleven the previous year, stood out from the rest; G. Chatburn and W. K. Harrison were good, but the bowlers did not get proper support, although G. Chatburn bowled well. G. B. Shepherd very steadily, and the slow leg-break bowling of J. E. Smith gave us considerable hope for the future. batting, with the notable exception of S. H. Edwards, was disappointing, and good stroke play was rare.

## Army Cadet Force.

The School unit which was formed in June, 1942, has had another successful year. The main object of the training is to develop leadership and so to equip the cadets that the prospects for their future careers, whether in the Forces or in civil life, are greatly increased.

The lack of suitable storage space and of much essential equipment have been difficulties with which we have had to contend.

In spite of these handicaps, much good work has been accomplished. Several cadets have been successful in gaining War Certificate A, Parts I and II. It is pleasing to hear good reports of some of our former cadets. Many of them have attained commissioned ranks in the Forces.

During the summer vacation 22 cadets and 3 officers attended camp at Altcar.

The unit at the moment is being reorganised. It has received the status of an independent unit, and in future will work in closer co-operation with cadets from other Grammar Schools.

Mr. S. Middleton, back from the Forces, will take over command of the unit, and will be assisted by other masters who have had recent experience of military service.

## Rugby Football, 1945-46.

We have had a very sound side, in spite of the fact that only four of the 1944-45 team returned to School.

A really good pack was led by T. Cowburn, the captain. All eight did splendid work, and it would be unjust to single out individuals for special mention.

- G. Chatburn made a first class scrum half. He was cool and experienced, and varied his tactics with skill. He needs only a little more quickness in the pass from the base of the scrum.
- T. G. H. Pimley had some inspired moments at stand-off half, but was not consistent.

Of the other backs, K. Baxendale was fast and powerful and the principal try-scorer. He had good support from L. F. Dickinson.

W. C. Fleet improved at full back.
