		• In line with government guidance KGS will be undertaking 'Mass asymptomatic testing' the school planned this as part of
		a phased return to school in January 2021.
		• Due to the national lockdown announced on 02/01/21 testing will only take place for those pupils and staff that are
		attending school as part of the vulnerable children and key worker care.
		General Principles:
		• Staff and pupils who return to the boarding house will be tested with a LFT (following consent being received) and will be
		retested 3 to 5 days later. They will then be tested weekly thereafter.
		• Staff and pupils or who are involved in Key Worker Care, will be offered the opportunity to have a LFT that will take
		place after consent has been received. They will then be tested twice a week.

[Quantities: <1litre/500g = low(L) <10Litres/1.5kg=medium(M)

>10litres/1.5kg=high(H)]

- Should a test result prove positive, the guidance in the testing handbook, page 18, will be followed. The person testing positive will be advised to self isolate and book a PCR test.
- Close contacts the guidance from the testing handbook will be followed, page 19, "serial contact tracing".
- Staff who will be involved in the testing process have been internally trained through the advice and guidance provided from literature, and online video training content.

• This risk assessment has been written and school routine adapted in line with guidance sort from the various government departments, local authority guidance and educational bodies (DfE, Public Health England, Lancashire Safeguarding board, Boarding Schools Association, AGBIS, ASCL, SOH, HMC

Communication

- Roles and responsibilities for the testing process have been made and published to those concerned.
- Necessary information is disseminated to all those staff involved in the testing process.
- The Senior Critical Incident Team communicate daily to monitor, plan and action developments.
- Consent form have been sent and received for all those pupils who will be tested.
- Appropriate advice posters will be available in and around the testing room. Page 22 / 23 of testing handbook.

Access to school site

- Access to school sites is mainly restricted to staff and pupils of KWC.
- Access to school buildings is predominantly restricted to specific staff and KWC pupil.
- There will be a one-way system to access and exit the testing area or provision made for adequate distancing if the number of pupils is small.
- For large cohorts, testing will take place in the SLH. For smaller groups of pupils appropriate alternative rooms will be utilised.
- Anyone who has covid19 symptoms, or if a member of their household has symptoms, have been informed not to come to school. Mass asymptomatic testing is an extra measure and not a facility for routine covid19 symptom testing.
