




## ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY

<b>Region</b>	An area of land with shared physical or human characteristics.
<b>Hydraulic action</b>	The force of water, trapping air in the cracks and breaking the rocks.
<b>Erosion</b>	The gradual destruction of rock by a force such as wind or tides.
<b>Headland and bays</b>	The movement of water erodes softer rock forming bays and leaves the harder rock leaving headlands.
<b>Surrounding</b>	Places that are nearby or border a place..
<b>Mouth</b>	The endpoint of a river where it flows into a larger body of water such as the sea.
<b>Tributary</b>	A river or stream flowing into a large river or lake.
<b>Estuary</b>	The tidal mouth of a large river where the tide meets the stream.
