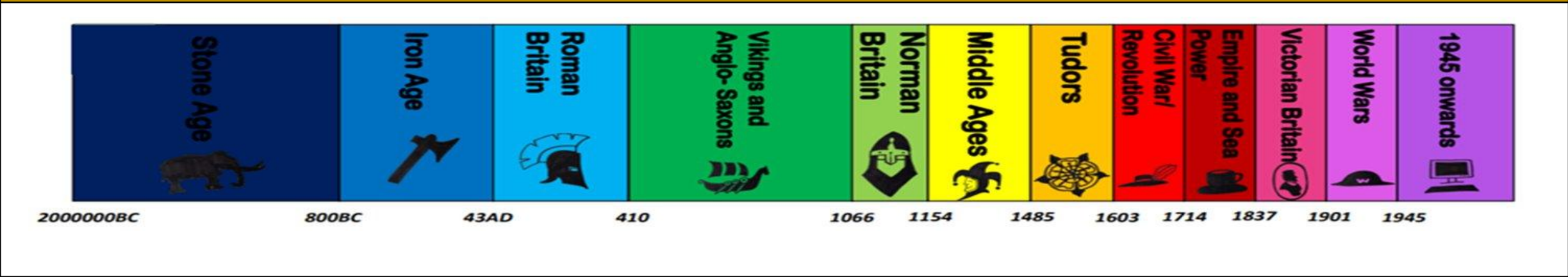


Timeline



ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY

Industrial Revolution	A period when Britain changed from a mainly farming society to one based on factories, machines and industry
Invention	A new machine, tool or idea that has been created to solve a problem or make something easier.
Transport	The ways people and goods are moved from one place to another, such as canals, railways, trams or roads.
Tourism	Travelling to a place for holidays, leisure or enjoyment.
Import	To bring goods into a country.

The Industrial Revolution changed Britain – factories, machines and new forms of transport transformed how people lived and worked.	
Richard Arkwright helped develop the factory system and his cotton mills changed the way cotton was produced.	
George Stephenson helped develop the railways, making it faster and easier to transport people and goods around Britain.	
Canals, railways, Blackpool's tram system and the Preston Bypass helped people, goods and tourists travel more easily.	
Alexander Graham Bell was credited with inventing the telephone.
