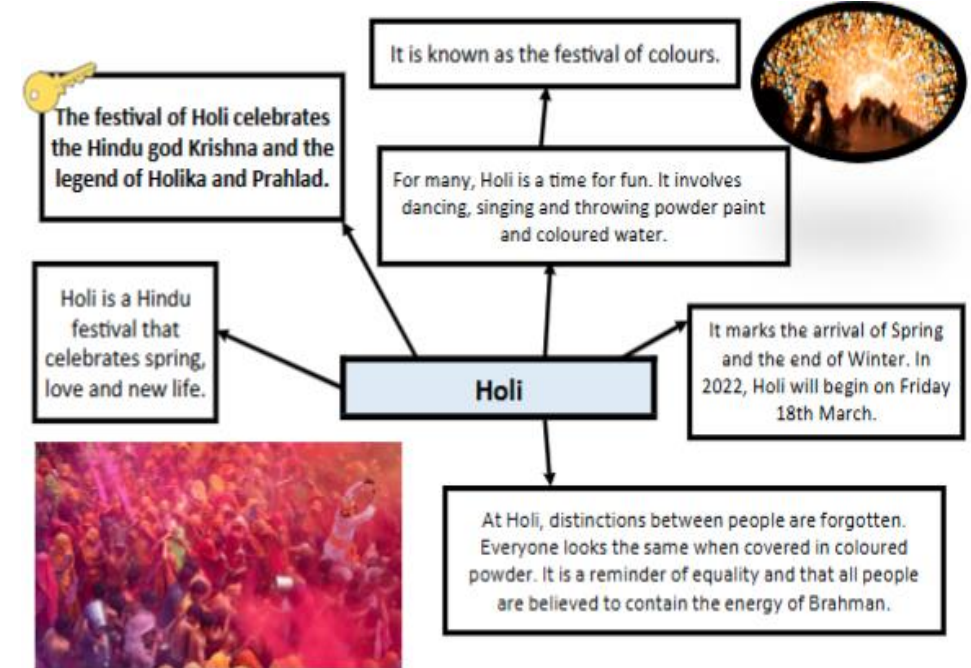
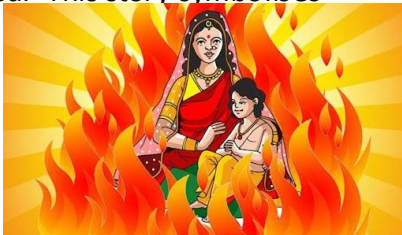
## Vocabulary you will learn:

Incarnation (avatar)	A person who embodies a deity or spirit.
Devotion	Love or loyalty towards a person or activity.
Scriptures	Sacred writing of a religion.
Universal truth	A statement or principle that is considered to be true for all people.

## The story of Holika and Prahlad.

The story of Holika and Prahlad explains the origin of Holi.

Prahlad, a devout follower of Vishnu, faced his evil father Hiranyakashipu's anger for rejecting evil. Holika, immune to fire, tried to burn him, but divine protection saved Prahlad while Holika perished. This story symbolises the triumph of faith and goodness over evil.
