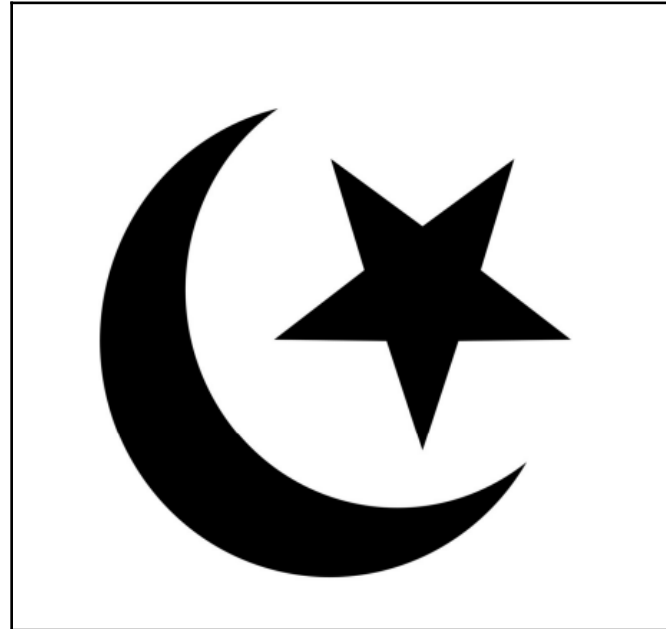

Muhammad and the Spider

When the Prophet Muhammad was hiding in a cave from his enemies, a small spider spun a web across the entrance. The enemies saw the web and thought, "No one could be inside, or the web would be broken."

Because of the spider, Muhammad was safe. Muslims believe this shows that Allah protects those who are good and trust Him. It also teaches kindness to all living things, even the smallest creatures.

Belief: Muslims believe in **one God (Allah)** and that **Muhammad is His messenger**.

Special Day: Eid al-Fitr – Celebrated at the end of Ramadan
